
Chilton keeps fit the Oregon way

The student ascends the ladder and positions himself on the diving board. Without flinching or looking down, he performs a graceful back dive off the highboard into Leighton Pool.

Just a typical student in a University springboard diving class? Wrong. Meet Bob Chilton, University graduate and the Northwestern intercollegiate springboard diving champion of 1935.

Chilton is back at the University after almost 50 years' absence, taking P.E. classes. 'The confidence he has in himself, you can tell he's a man of action," says Lani Loken-Dahle, University springboard diving instructor and one of Chilton's biggest fans. "He did that back dive off the high board...afterward he told me he hadn't done one since 1955," she says.

Chilton, originally from Klamath Falls, returned to Eugene in 1977 after retiring from his Los Angeles-area career as a test pilot and administrator for Rockwell International. Chilton went to Rockwell, formerly North American Aviation, in 1940, and began testing planes for the U.S. Army Air Corps in 1941.

"I think the first time I got the idea to be a pilot is when Lind-


