Senators back limit on funds for defense

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Republican-controlled Senate Budget Committee, in a sharp rebuff to President Ronald Reagan, voted tentatively Tuesday to reduce Reagan's military buildup by \$79 billion during the next three years.

On a bipartisan vote of 18-4, the committee proposed freezing defense-spending authority at current levels after adjusting for inflation for the year beginning Oct. 1. That would be followed by after-inflation increases of 3 percent for each of the two subsequent years.

The committee considered five plans that would have allowed defense spending to rise each year but by less than the amount Reagan wants.

The plan that won tentative committee approval is sponsored by Sen. Ernest Hollings, D-S.C., and would hold the increase far below the range proposed by Reagan.

It was the first formal indication of the widespread dissatisfaction in Congress over the president's proposed 1986 budget, which includes a \$30 billion increase in defense spending and nearly \$40 billion in cuts to domestic programs.

The vote came a few hours after Senate Majority Leader Robert Dole, R-Kan., said the administration must be prepared to negotiate with House and Senate leaders to get a "consensus" budget that will reduce federal deficits.

White House spokesman Larry Speakes said Reagan "stands squarely behind his budget."

Bush 'deeply moved' at refugee compound

KASSALA, Sudan (AP) — Vice President George Bush toured a camp of starving refugees Tuesday and appealed to the Soviet-backed Ethiopian government to "give a little" and allow food shipments to pass through rebel-held provinces.

The vice president visited the Wad Sheriffe refugee camp, where he held a crying infant in his arms and helped feed another with a life-sustaining soybean milk formula.

Bush called the experience "awesome" and added, "You

can't help but see that and be deeply moved."

As he has in the past, Bush accused the government of Ethiopian President Mengistu Haile Mariam of blocking food shipments to the rebel-held provinces.

Noting that he stood only a few miles from Ethiopia's border, Bush said "They ought to give a little. They ought to realize there is a great human tragedy here. I would appeal to Mengistu to do just that."

The rebels have proposed a truce on several occasions so that food can be brought to the millions of starving people in the north, but the Addis Ababa government has rejected the idea. Most aid from Western groups has been transported into the rebel areas through neighboring Sudan.

Eugene toddler gets new liver

SACRAMENTO, Calif. (AP) — After a year-long wait, 2-year-old Denita Alexander of Eugene finally received the new liver that could save her life.

The child, who suffers from a terminal liver disease, underwent an 11½-hour transplant operation Monday night at the University of California-Davis Medical Center.

Surgery began at about 10:30 p.m. Monday and was finished at about 10 a.m. Tuesday, said David Knower, an Albany attorney who has represented the child since her birth in October 1982.

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
