Benefits for jobless on the line

WASHINGTON (AP) — With federal benefits for 339,000 jobless Americans set to expire at week's end, House Democrats are trying to buck President Ronald Reagan by pushing an extension of the program he wants to let die.

Last week, the House Ways and Means subcommittee on unemployment approved a bill extending through June 30 supplemental unemployment benefits for those who have already exhausted their regular 26 weeks of payments. The program is to expire Saturday.

Reagan announced his opposition to the extension at his March 21 news conference, saying "the place now for people who are having problems is our job-training program, particularly job training directed at those who have to be relocated because something has happened to the industries that they formerly worked in."

House Majority Whip Thomas Foley, D-Wash., says action could come as early as Tuesday on the House floor. However, the attempt could be blocked if Republicans invoke a rule re-

quiring a two-thirds vote for bills moved that quickly.

Sen. Bob Packwood of Oregon, chair of the the Republican-controlled Finance Committee, has said he will oppose anything more than a phase-out of the current program. The finance panel has scheduled a meeting on the unemployment compensation issue for Tuesday.

A phase-out limited to people already on the rolls would cost about \$100 million, compared to the \$270 million price tag of the Democratic plan.

House Majority Leader Jim Wright, D-Texas, noted that the Democratic proposal is only a temporary extension and said last week he hoped for a compromise.

Meanwhile, the Senate's get-tough attitude toward trade with Japan could spread to the House this week. The Senate last week voted 92-0 to approve a non-binding resolution urging Reagan to retaliate with quotas and tariffs if Japan doesn't open its markets to more American products.

Ferraro blasts Post coverage

ALBANY, N.Y. (AP) — Geraldine Ferraro says the press was generally fair to her during her 1984 Democratic vice presidential campaign, even though one newspaper printed stories she says were "totally false."

Ferraro, speaking before the New York State Press Association on Saturday, said that during her campaign certain New York Post articles implied her family was connected to organized crime.

"The implication they lodged was totally false and unsupported by the facts," she said. "Am I unjust in believing that some members of the press are unfair — worse than unfair, that they abuse their power so as to harass, defame, and try to defeat a candidate for public office?"

Manson disciple refuses release

ALDERSON, W.Va. (AP) — Charles Manson family member Sandra Good, who refused to accept parole because it would bar her from associating with Manson or his followers, will come up again for release in 60 days, officials said.

Good, 35, who served 10 years for mailing death threats to businessmen, refused Friday to accept a release certificate containing the conditions, said Gwynne Sizer, warden at the Federal Correctional Institution for Women.

"She has been an excellent prisoner in her 10 years here, but she remains very committed to Charlie Manson," added Dave Helman, the warden's executive assistant.

In 1969 Good bore a son — Pooh Bear — who was sired by Manson. The cult leader and three followers were convicted for the 1969 murders of actress Sharon Tate and eight other persons.

Good attended the University for one term in 1962.



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
