Women undefeated 6-0 Ducks cruise past BYU and Bears

The Oregon women's track-and-field team made a triumphant return to Hayward Field on Saturday as the Ducks defeated the University of California and Brigham Young University in a double dual.

Oregon ran its dual-meet season mark to 6-0 with the victories.

The Ducks thrashed BYU,

103-33, and the Bears of Cal, 110-24, in the meet, which was the last home dual encounter for ten Oregon seniors.

A dripping wet Oregon coach Tom Heinonen got to toast the victories from the steeplechase pit where he was thrown in by the entire team after the meet.

"I'm really pleased with the individual performances," Heinonen said. "The weather is a lot better than anything we've

seen in the past two weeks."

Heinonen was referring to the past two weeks where the Ducks have been on the road to Nebraska and Pullman, Wash. In those two places, the Ducks have seen everything from gusty winds to falling snow.

Saturday in Eugene it was a sunny 65 degrees with a slight wind from the north. A far contrast to the wind and snow.

Oregon's seniors made the most of the day as they accounted for nine of the Ducks' 11 individual wins in the meet.

Senior Tracy Raade swept the 100- and 200-meter races. Quenna Beasley added victories in both the discus and shot put. Sally Harmon remained undefeated in the javelin this year, and Leann Warren toyed with the field in winning the 1,500-meters. Claudette Groenendaal ran the fastest 800-meter time in the nation so far this year. While Julie Hilsenteger won the 400 meters as the Oregon seniors were dominant throughout the afternoon.

Kathy Hayes started the day for Oregon by running a special 10,000-meters in order to qualify for the NCAA Championships to be held in late May in Austin, Texas. Hayes, the defending national champion in the event, had little trouble qualifying in 33:45.60, even though her only competitor dropped out of the race short of the four-mile mark.

"It was kind of lonely out there, but the crowd really helped me out," Hayes said. "I'm glad to get my qualifying time out of the way."

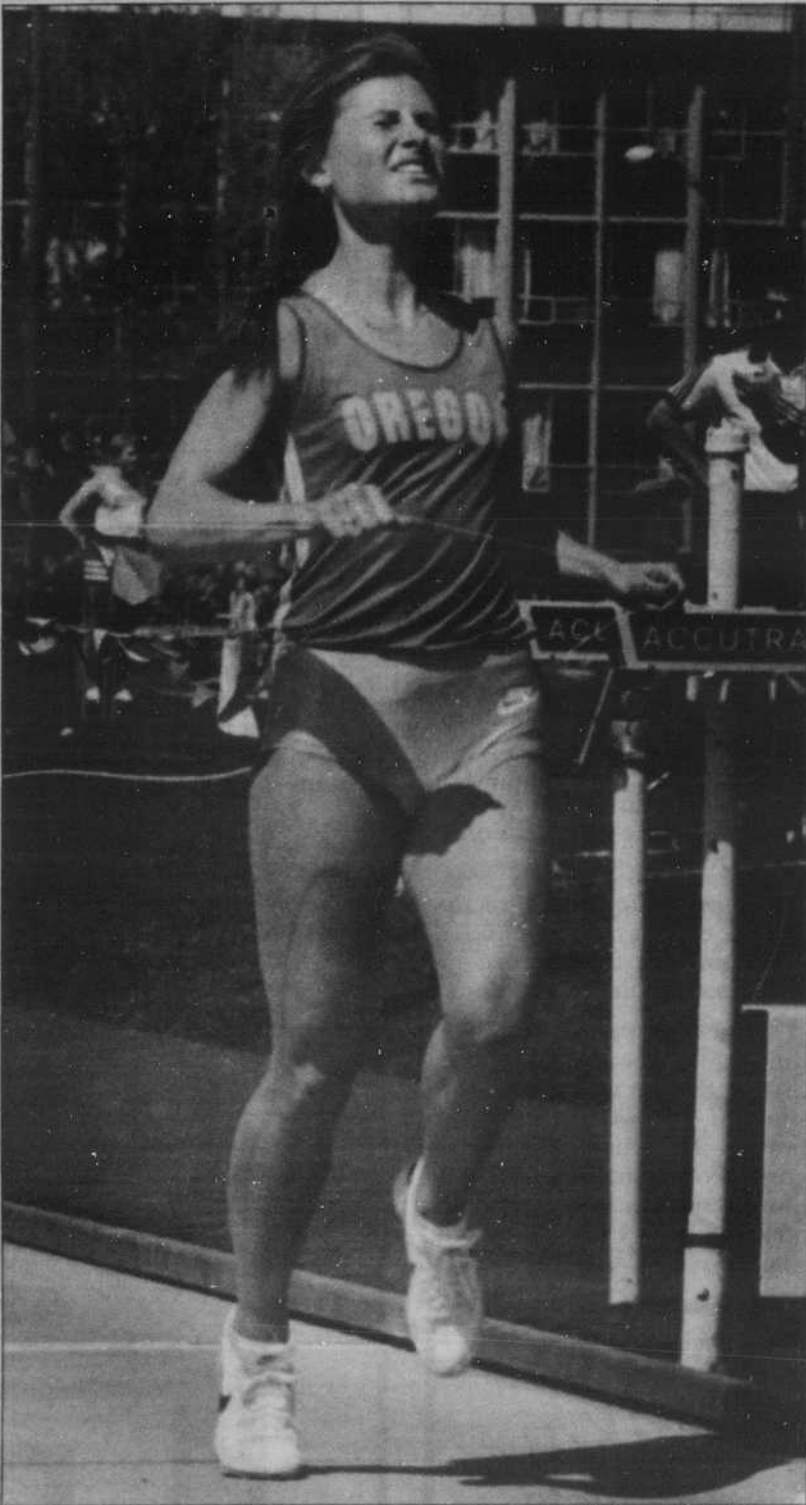
Junior Brenda Bushnell also got in on the fun as she qualified for the NCAAs in the 3,000 meters in 9:22.58.

"Now I can relax and concentrate on the NCAAs," Bushnell said.

Julie Goodrich added Oregon's other individual victory in the triple jump with a wind-aided 38-3/4 leap.

Although the seniors will get a chance to compete at least one more time at Hayward next week in the Oregon Pepsi Relays, Saturday's meet was definitely sentimental for the outgoing athletes.

"I didn't even realize it was the last one until they announced it over the public address system," Groenendaal said.
