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Packwood praises tax plan

WASHINGTON (AP) — Republican Sen. Bob Packwood of Oregon, chair of the Senate Finance Committee, says he likes what he's seen of the Reagan administration's latest tax reform strategy.

But the senator's Democratic counterpart in the House, Rep. Dan Rostenkowski, D-Ill., is more cautious about the new reform package.

President Ronald Reagan, who has said his aim is to streamline the tax system, close various loopholes, and some tax breaks and use the money to lower personal tax rates, will announce a major tax reform package in a televised address

tonight.

Advance indications are that the president's plan will be less stringent than the one outlined by his own Treasury Department in November. That plan would have raised corporate taxes by about 35 percent to pay for slashing taxes paid overall by individuals by about 8.5 percent.

Packwood, who after being named Finance Committee chair last year questioned the value of simplifying the tax system, appears to have changed his mind.

Speaking Sunday on ABC-TV's "This Week," Packwood said he had "worked extensive-

ly" with Treasury Secretary James Baker during the drafting of Reagan's plan. "and if it comes out as we've talked, I'll be very pleased."

Rostenkowski, chair of the House Ways and Means Committee, was more circumspect, but he said Democrats were ready to work with the president to adopt tax reform legislation. Rostenkowski appeared on NBC-TV's "Meet the Press" Sunday.

Last year, Packwood questioned "simplification for the sake of simplification" in any sweeping rewrite of the tax code.

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State tax package clears panel

SALEM (AP) — A \$247 million tax increase package was approved Monday by the House Revenue Committee in a move that legislative leaders said is a key step toward adjournment of the 1985 session.

The taxes likely will be acted on by the full House on Friday, and Revenue Committee Chair Tom Throop, D-Bend, predicted they will be approved and taken up by the Senate next week.

The tax measures mainly are continuation of temporary tax hikes that are set to expire but

that legislative leaders have decided to keep alive to balance the state budget and to provide some money for state property tax relief programs.

They include:

• House Bill 2011, which puts much of Oregon's income tax code in line with stingier federal tax laws. Reduced deductions for businesses and higher-income taxpayers would boost state income tax collections by \$72 million.

• HB 2183, which contains two separate cigarette tax in-

creases raising \$92 million. One would continue the current 10-cent-per-pack tax. The other would impose an additional eight-cent-per-pack state tax to replace a federal cigarette tax that may expire.

• HB 2182, which permanently changes Oregon's \$1,000 personal exemption to an \$85 income tax credit and also delays indexing the credit to the rate of inflation until 1987. By continuing the less expensive credit and by not increasing it to keep pace with inflation, the state would bring in \$83 million.

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Voter-registration bills fail

SALEM (AP) — The House State and Federal Affairs Committee failed to get a majority vote Monday for any proposal requiring an earlier voter registration deadline.

However, several members said later that they'll attach registration cutoff proposals to another bill the full House will consider this week to extend Oregon's vote-by-mail experiment.

Oregon currently has same-day voter registration. Some

lawmakers want to change that in the wake of last fall's controversy surrounding the busing of homeless by the Rajneeshees to Wasco County.

The two major proposals include halting registration four days before the election and requiring those who register within 12 days of the election to provide evidence of Oregon residence, or ending registration 20 days before the election and requiring proof of residence 20 days before then.

Two killed at Lake Shasta

REDDING, Calif. (AP) — The two victims of Saturday night's boating accident in Lake Shasta were identified Monday as Oregon State University students.

The Shasta County sheriff's department identified the vic-

tims as Thomas Morrish, whose body was recovered, and Lorie Chiarella, whose body had not been found.

Officers said the pair jumped from a boat that turned around to pick them up but ran over them instead, killing them instantly.

They said the two had come to Lake Shasta with a group of OSU students who rented houseboats for the Memorial Day weekend.

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
