Legislative Update

Here are highlights of the Oregon Legislature last week.

Coors

The House State and Federal Affairs Committee on Friday inserted language that would allow retail sales of Coors beer in Oregon into an alcohol bill that previously passed the Senate. The measure was sent to the full House; if it passes the House in a vote expected next week, it will go directly back to the Senate for a vote.

Under current Oregon law, Coors can only be sold for drinking in taverns or for purchase in large allotments from warehouses. The beer is kept out of Oregon stores by a law that bans retail sales of non-pasteurized beer. Coors is brewed through a filtration process.

Critics of both the brewery and its family owners have charged that they are racist, discriminatory toward women, anti-union and big backers of right-wing causes.

The Colorado brewery has been non-union since a 1977 strike, and pressure from unions and liberal legislators has buried legislative attempts to open the Oregon market to Coors.

But that opposition has been muted by Coors' agreements to improve economic ties with Hispanics and blacks and by the lobbying of other union breweries wanting to sell non-pasteurized beer in Oregon.

Taxes

A \$247 million package of income tax and cigarette tax increases passed in the House and now faces a vote in the Senate. Supporters say the tax plan, which mainly continues "temporary taxes" that otherwise expire, is a major step toward bringing the 1985 legislative session to a close soon.

House Bill 2011 will tie the state tax code to the federal Tax Reform Act of 1984 and cost taxpayers about \$72 million. HB 2183 will increase the tax on a pack of cigarettes from 9 cents to 27 cents, which will raise \$92.4 million to be divided between the state, cities and counties.

HB 2182 makes permanent an \$85 tax credit taxpayers have received since 1983 in lieu of a \$1,000 personal exemption. That measure will raise \$83 million during the biennium.

All-terrain Vehicles

All-terrain vehicles would come under state regulation for the first time under a bill that won the Senate's approval on Friday.

Under the all-terrain vehicle bill (HB 2343), owners would be required to pay a \$10 registration fee every two years and a \$7 title fee.

Anybody who operates an all-terrain vehicle and who doesn't already have a valid driver's license would be required to pass an operator safety course and receive a permit.

In addition, operators would be liable for damage to wilderness areas and to private property. The measure now returns to the House for concurrence.

Miscellaneous

The House passed a proposed ballot measure (House Joint Resolution 30) that would require a special election to be held to fill a vacant U.S. Senate seat.

The proposed ballot measure dealing with U.S. Senate vacancies is aimed at changing the current procedure of allowing the governor to fill a vacancy by appointing someone of the same political party.

Under current law, the appointee then serves until the next general election. If approved by the Senate, the resolution will be placed on the May primary ballot next year.

• A move to increase Oregon's "basic rule" speed limit from 55 mph to 65 mph was officially laid to rest by a House and Senate negotiating committee. That came after warnings that raising the speed limit would jeopardize federal highway money and increase highway fatalities.

• A bill aimed at eliminating sex discrimination in insurance policies was approved by the Senate and now goes to the House. Supporters said that by prohibiting insurance companies from considering a person's sex in setting insurance rates, women will pay less for insurance. Opponents said just the opposite will occur.

• Women who claimed injury from the Dalkon Shield intrauterine device but who couldn't sue the manufacturer under existing law would get a second chance under a bill passed by the House. Under the bill, women who've had their claims for damages thrown out of court under the statute of limitations would have an additional year to refile their suit.

• A bill to crack down on child pornography was unanimously approved by the Senate and now awaits House action. The bill increases penalties for buying or selling child pornography and makes it illegal to film sexual activity by children under 16.

• The Senate approved a measure to designate Martin Luther King, Jr.'s birthday as a state holiday.
