Higher education budget wins unanimous approval of Senate

SALEM (AP) — The Senate on Tuesday unanimously adopted a \$452 million general fund budget for the State System of Higher Education, a budget that a key lawmaker says is 15 percent over current spending levels.

The higher education budget, which includes \$1.4 million to freeze tuition at Oregon's eight state colleges and universities during the 1986-87 school year, now goes to the House.

Legislators said the two-year budget contains the largest increase of any state agency budget approved by the Legislature so far this session.

"We've been very, very generous," said Sen. Mike Thorne, D-Pendleton, co-chair of the Joint Ways and Means Committee. "Given what we know today, the system is going to be going out with a 15 percent increase."

Thorne was responding to several legislators who said the money wasn't enough to solve higher education's problems.

"Higher education is sadly underfunded," said Sen. Frank Roberts, D-Portland, a former Portland State University professor. "We haven't

gone far enough, but we've gone as far as our resources will allow."

Roberts said the funding was inadequate to add needed new buildings and replace outdated instructional equipment.

Sen. L.B. Day, R-Salem, put part of the blame for those problems on the State Board of Higher Education, which he said has "diverted" funds intended to relieve those problems to other uses.

Money for faculty salary increases is expected to be approved this week by a salary subcommittee headed by Sen. Ed Fadeley, D-Eugene.

The budget does not include funding for economic-development related program expansions at the University, Oregon State and Portland State universities or the Oregon Institute of Technology.

The \$11.6 million sought by Gov. Vic Atiyeh for those projects is contained in a separate bill, as is \$18.7 million for new university buildings, that would be financed from state lottery proceeds. Action on that bill is pending.

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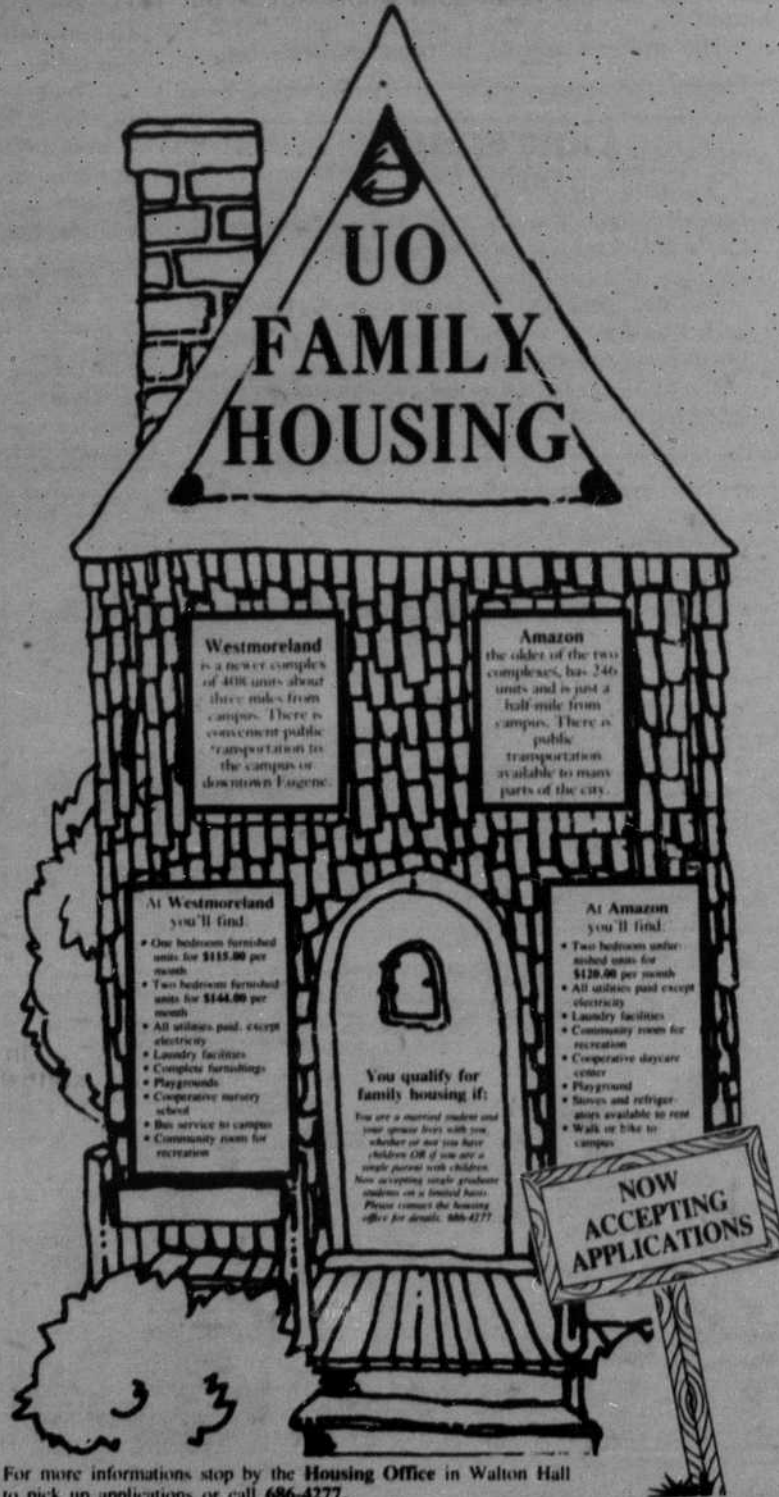
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
