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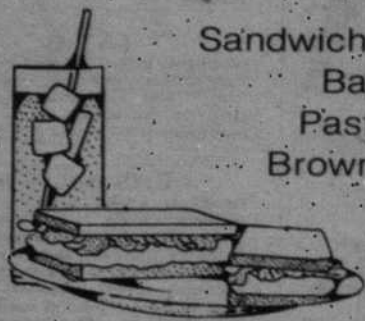

New Frontier Market to host The Cashiers' farewell party

It seems a musical era is about to end in Eugene as The Cashiers, hailed as one of the area's hottest rock 'n' roll groups, are planning a final performance this Saturday in the WOW Hall beginning at 9 p.m.

The Cashiers' decision to disband after three years came as a surprise to many of the group's followers, says Joanie Kleban, manager of Eugene's New Frontier Market, which is co-hosting the event along with the Community Center for the Performing Arts.

Kleban says changes also are unfolding in the market as this Westside community fixture since 1973, with its colorful sign claiming one can find "anything from Tofu to TV dinners" on the store's shelves, is changing owners Aug. 17. Local businessowner Rich Hardy will take over the operation and hopefully maintain the market's pleasant atmosphere, Kleban says.

Originally, a double farewell celebration was not on the agenda for the market or The Cashiers, Kleban says. Although The Cashiers were first on the list for entertainment when owner Cary Thompson decided to sell the business and hold a party to thank his customers, Kleban says no one in the store had any idea the rock group also was planning a final farewell party.

Both the market and The Cashiers decided to celebrate together at the WOW Hall. Kleban says this seems appropriate because the building also is a well-known Westside fixture that holds many community memories, including The Cashiers' first public gig in December 1982.

Since that time, the band became so successful that they began a steady tour of per-

mances up and down the West Coast.

The Cashiers and Thompson say the final farewell will be a happy parting full of best wishes for old friends going off in new directions. Thompson plans to devote his time to operating Eugene's Red Barn and Grocery and The Cashiers will be pursuing separate careers.

Admission is \$3.50 at the door. The hall is wheelchair accessible, all ages are welcome and adult refreshments will be available with ID.
