

## Computers in education topic of conference

A computer conference geared to participants interested in applying computer technologies in education will be held Aug. 19-21 at the Eugene Conference Center.

The keynote speaker will be Terrel Bell, secretary of education during the first term of the Reagan administration. Bell is best known for his report "A Nation At Risk," which highlighted many inadequacies of the American public education system.

Bell is expected to discuss the need to bring technology into the mainstream of education.

In addition to Bell's address, the University Continuation Center-sponsored conference will feature talks by internationally recognized experts in the field. Some of the topics to be covered include teaching strategies, human factors, brain research, cognitive psychology and the management of student services.

Those attending will be free to try out hundreds of software programs and make their own copies of public domain software at a review lab during the conference.

Pre-conference "hands-on" workshops are scheduled for Saturday and Sunday, at the Hilton. Topics include Appleworks, Computers and Composition and Teacher Tools.

University graduate-level credit is available for \$28 per credit for both the pre-conference workshops and the general conference sessions.

Registration costs for the full conference are \$65 for University students, \$95 for University faculty and staff and \$135 for other individuals.

Those wishing to attend only specific lectures or one or two days of the conference may do so at reduced rates.
