Comparable worth topic of lecture

A lecture titled "Political Economy of Comparable Worth" will be given on Oct. 10 by Heidi Hartmann, the study director for the Committee on Women's Employment and Related Social Issues. Hartmann's speech will be at 12:30 p.m. in the EMU Dad's Room.

Hartmann has worked as an economist in the Office of Research, U.S. Commission on Civil Rights, and was a lecturer in the Department of Economics, Univer-

sity of Maryland and in the Women's Studies Program, George Washington University. She has held several positions with the National Academy of Sciences/National Research Council.

Other lectures include: "Landscape Architecture in Boston: Innovation and Development," Oct. 15; "The Boston Public Library: A Palace for the People," 4:30 p.m. Oct. 18; "Preserving What, Where and How: Boston's Back Bay - A Case Study," Oct. 22; "Fitting In: CBI's

Approach to Architecture in Boston," Oct. 29; and "Making a Plan for Boston: Keeping Identity in a Global Culture," Nov. 5.

The series will include Kenneth Helphand, a landscape architecture professor, Oct. 15; Leland Roth, art history professor, Oct. 18; Jean Paul Carlhian, architect with Shepley Bulfinch Richardson & Abbott of Boston, Oct. 22; Richard Bertman, architect with Childs Bertman Tseckares and Casendino of Boston, Oct. 29; and Robert Campbell, architecture critic of the Boston Globe, Nov. 5.

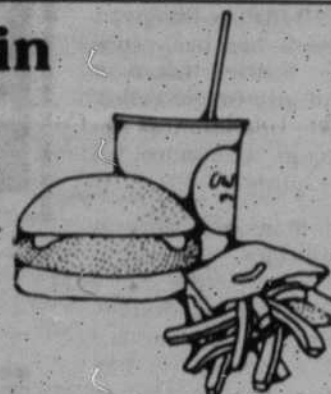
