There will be other subjects whose pay can vary from \$4 to \$6, \$4 to \$8, \$4 to \$20 or \$4 to \$66 depending on the experiment subjects get assigned to. Assignment will be by lottery. Apart from this variable pay, everyone who is confirmed for participation and shows up at the appropriate time is paid \$3 at the end of the experiment, so for some participants the final pay can vary between \$3 and \$11, and for others between \$7 to \$9, \$7 to \$11, \$7 to \$23, or \$7 to \$71.
