Lecture kicks off series

The University Forum will kick off its 1985-86 lecture schedule Oct. 22 with a talk titled "Fish Runs to Flu Victims:

Twenty-Five Years of Archaeology in Alaska."

The culture of the prehistoric settlers of Alaska, their initial migration to the area and their encounter with the industrialized world will be discussed by Don Dumond, University an-

thropology professor and director of the University Museum of Natural History.

The lecture is at 8 p.m. in the Eugene Conference Center.

Carlhian, who was educated in France, also served as a consultant on the French-American Committee for the Restoration of the Statue of Liberty.

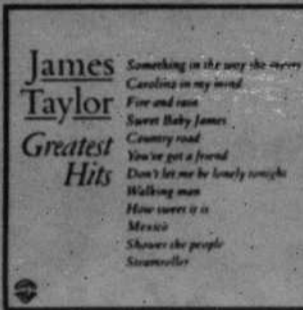

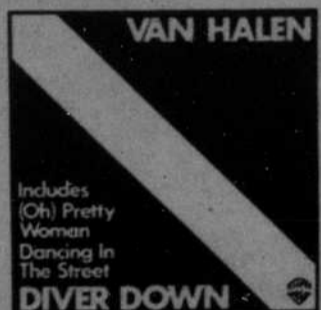

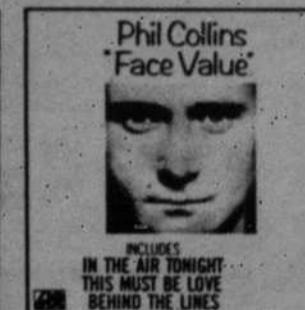
