Harbour nears mark for kills

Oregon's volleyball team, 11-14 on the season, will begin the second round of NorPac Conference play by hosting the University of Washington tonight and Washington State University Saturday. Both matches will begin at 7:30 p.m. in McArthur Court.

The Ducks enter this weekend's matches with a 5-1 conference mark and a second place standing in the NorPac title race. Oregon's only conference loss was to San Jose State University, which currently leads the conference with a perfect 6-0 record and is ranked fourth in the NCAA.

The Oregon netters crushed both Washington and WSU in three games earlier in the season on the road.

"They both have gotten better and we can't take them lightly, especially Washington," head coach Chris Voelz said. "We still need to beat them in three to keep a collar on them."

The Ducks will not only be looking to collect two conference victories this weekend but to get closer to approaching the 500 mark for the season.

All-American middle-blocker Sue Harbour will be trying for 2,000 career kills in Oregon's upcoming contests against the

Washington squads.

This outstanding senior volleyball player has recorded 1,986 kills in her career as a Duck. The closest an Oregon volleyball player has ever come to this number was Tamra Chambers, who collected 1,005 kills in her career from 1979-81.

"I suspect that maybe two players in the nation have gotten that many kills," Voelz said. "And very few players will ever have that many."

"It is our suspicion that no one in the nation has ever recorded 2,000 kills," said John Lashway, an assistant in Oregon's Sports Information Department.

Lashway did, however, point out that volleyball records are difficult to look into and not always available because it is fairly new to the sports scene.

Nonetheless, Harbour was second in the nation in kills last year and led the nation two years ago. With numbers like this, Harbour seems to be a prominent candidate for perhaps the national record.

Harbour needs only 14 kills this weekend to surpass the 2,000-kill milestone. With her reputation and past performances, Harbour will most likely reach that milestone tonight against the Huskies.

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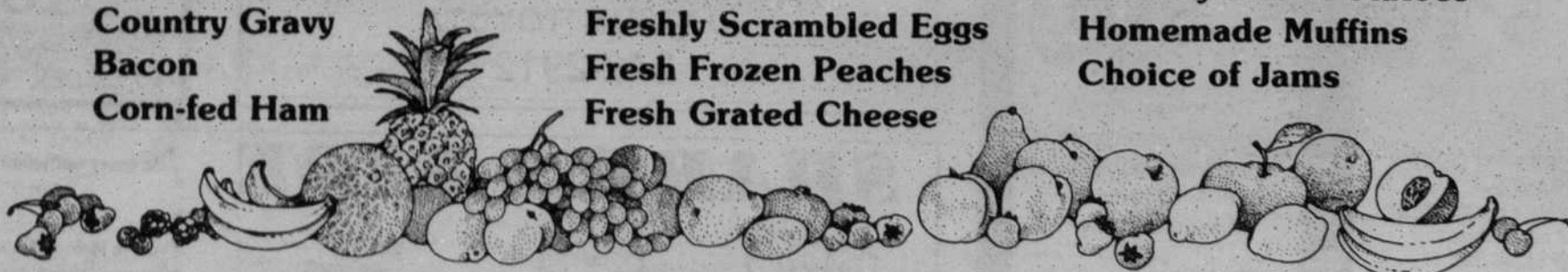
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
