### Sexual offenses

Case Law — OR code 163.305 OR Law, 1971. "Sexual Offenses:"

1. "Deviate sexual intercourse" means sexual conduct between persons, consisting of contact between the sex organs of one person and the mouth or anus of another.

6. "Sexual contact" means any touching of the sexual or other intimate parts of a person, or causing such person to touch the sexual or other intimate parts of the actor for the purpose of arousing or gratifying the sexual desire of either party.

7. "Sexual intercourse" has its ordinary meaning and occurs upon any penetration, however slight; emission is not required.

163.305 Law Review, Citations: 51 OLR 492 (1977) "Intimate Parts;" Genitalia and breasts are intimate parts as a matter of law under this section, and undeveloped genitalia and breasts of children are included within the definition.

### Give directly

Dori Molletti's letter (ODE, Nov. 15) points out something which I totally agree with — the many deserving agencies within this community. I urge generous giving to these agencies, but directly, not through United Way. I also urge people to obtain and read Planned Parenthood's literature for themselves, especially the "Federation Policies."

The objection is made by United Way leadership that their funding of Planned Parenthood is not used for abortions.
