

# IFC funds group despite lack of members

After several years of declining interest, the Political Science Student Union was allocated funds by the Incidental Fee Committee to work on increasing membership in the organization.

By a unanimous vote, the IFC approved a budget of \$255 for the 1986-1987 fiscal year.

Lance Campbell, director of the student union, said the organization has not been active in recent years. But he said emphasis will be placed on increasing membership and fund raising within the organization.

Campbell said the approved funds would just be a starting point. The purpose for such a small funding request, was to encourage the organization to initiate some fund raising of its own, he said.

Although the Cultural Forum invites some speakers to talk about political topics, the student union should have a valid interest in encouraging speakers, Campbell said.

The group will receive \$100 for political speakers, while the remaining \$155 will be used to help offset printing and advertising costs.

Much of the printing costs will be for posters to improve public awareness of the group and for postage to send infor-

mation to potential speakers. In addition, some money will be spent for several advertisements in the Oregon Daily Emerald.

Although there are only about 12 people currently involved in the organization, the student union was active for several years at the University with activities such as a mock Senate and mock United Nations.

Campbell said the mock Senate was run by students, and participants received academic credit for the activity. But the group ran into trouble when a student protested a grade he received from another student.

There was a falling-out, and the student union became alienated with the

political science department, he said. This caused a steady decline in membership until this year.

"Despite my optimism, I'm wondering if (the student union) is going to work," Campbell said. "I'd like to prove that apathy isn't controlling academia."

The organization plans to implement a "talk politics" session. The biweekly sessions would be designed to discuss topics of interest to the group.

Campbell said the sessions would also be informal enough to provide social exchange for the members. Although many of the members are political science majors, anyone is welcome to join the organization.

## University rally squad set for national competition

The University varsity cheerleading squad is one of the more than 150 colleges and university teams scheduled to participate in the Ford College Cheerleading Championship for 1985.

Now in its fourth year, the annual competition showcases the most outstanding squads in the United States based on enthusiasm, timing, rhythm, athletic ability and overall effect of performance on spectators. Finals will be held at Sea World in San Diego in January.

This year the competition will include Division I and Division II schools in addition to Division I-A colleges. Winners will be chosen in each category as squads vie for national recognition as well as an all expense paid trip to San Diego from the Ford Motor Company.

Each squad will submit an unedited videotape of a cheer, sideline chant and fight song for

judging.

"We'll be scrutinizing these tapes for cheerleading skills and techniques as well as crowd appeal," said Jeff Webb, president of Universal Cheerleading Association, the sanctioning body for the event. "Cheerleading on the college level requires superior gymnastic skill, tremendous stamina and real communication with the crowd. That's what our judges will be looking for."

The final competition will be broadcast over the Entertainment and Sports Programming Network, Webb said. Last year, NBC telecast the finals from Hawaii.

UCA, now in its 11th year of operation, held more than 120 clinics and camps in 28 states for over 45,000 high school and college cheerleaders this summer.
