



## **Blazers tangle with Lakers**

PORTLAND, Ore. (AP) — The Portland Trail Blazers are playing their best basketball of the season, and Coach Jack Ramsay says there's no single reason for the team's recent turnaround.

"When a team is playing well, there's no one thing that makes it play well," Ramsay said. "It's a combination of things."

The Blazers, winners of seven of their last nine games, begin their final long road trip of the National Basketball Association season Wednesday night when they play the Los Angeles Lakers.

The trip also includes stops in Milwaukee,

New York, Cleveland and Indiana.

Although Ramsay says there is more than one factor to the team's success, he says much of the credit must go to the improved play of forward Mychal Thompson.

Thompson, often maligned for what has been perceived as a laid-back attitude, is averaging just 14 points per game this season. But in his last four games he's averaged 23.3 points per contest.

"There's a big relationship between Mychal Thompson's performance and the team's performance," Ramsay said. "When Mychal plays well, the team plays well."
"I think Mychal decided he's got to do

it . . . He's really gone after it much better," Ramsay said. "He's played more aggressively and that's the key to that success."

Eleven games ago, Ramsay decided to remove Darnell Valentine from the Blazer picture and shift Steve Colter into the starting point

"I think that clarified some roles a little better for the guards," Ramsay said of the move.
"And it also enabled me to give Jim Paxson some more minutes on the floor."

Paxson, often in the playmaking role, has averaged 7.6 assists in each of his last eight

At the same time Valentine was removed from the lineup, Clyde Drexler voluntarily left his starting role and became the first player off the bench. His game since has exploded.

In four games last week, Drexler averaged 21.3 points, nine rebounds, 9.3 assists and 2.8 steals per contest. He hit 61.3 percent of his field goal tries and had two "triple doubles" -- games in which he hit double figures in points, reboards and assists. The effort earned the 6-foot-7 guard NBA player of the week honors.

Ramsay doesn't think Drexler's improvement can be traced to his decision to relegate himself to

"He's doing very well off the bench, but I think Clyde would do as well if he started. I don't think there's necessarily a change in his play," Ramsay said, "but I think the team has benefited from him coming off the bench."

There are other indications of the team's improvement. Kiki Vandeweghe's scoring average over the past nine games is 27.2, about four points higher than it has been the rest of the season. Center Sam Bowie has hit 69 percent of his field goals the last five contests.

"I think everybody has picked up," Ramsay

The Blazers have made just 49 percent of their field goal tries this season, but have shot better than 50 percent in each of their last nine games. Portland, notoriously weak on the boards in the early season, has had a rebound advantage in 11 of its last 14 contests. . .

Despite all the improvements, the Blazers, should know the road trip may not get off to a great start. The Lakers, who have an eight-game lead over Portland in the Pacific Division, have beaten the Blazers 11 of the last 13 times the two teams have met.
