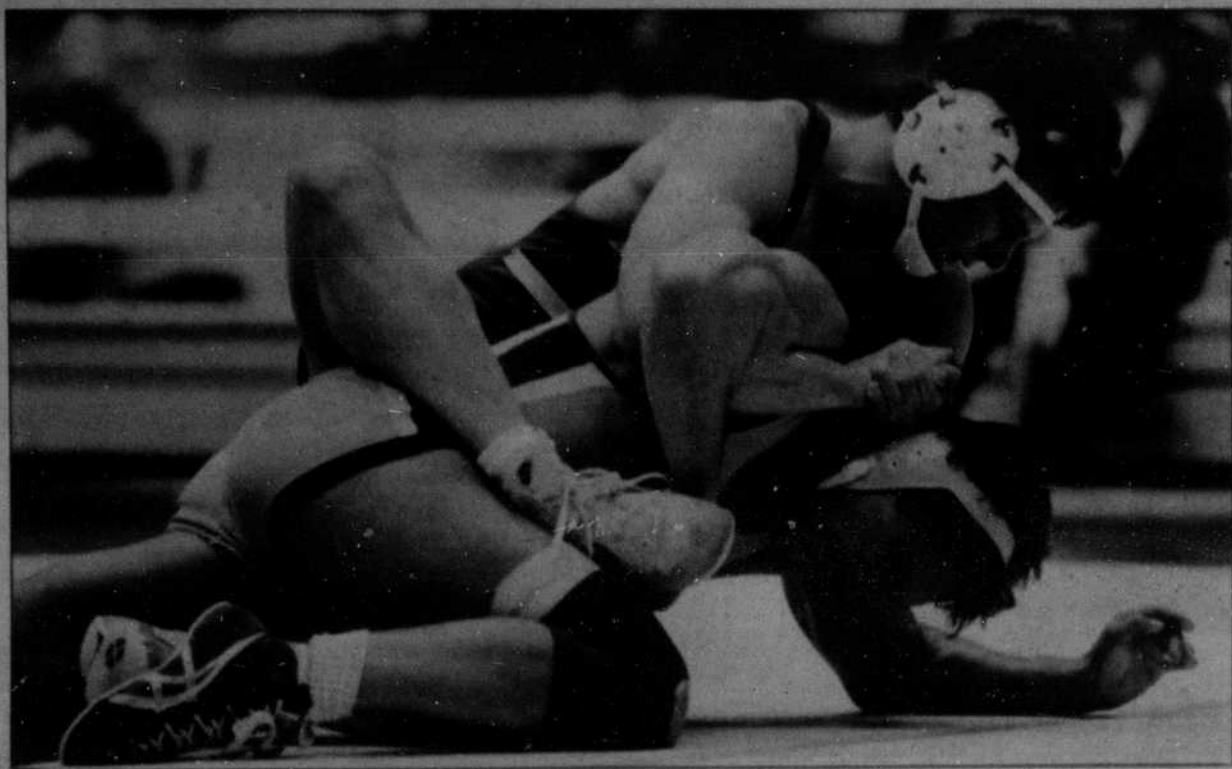

Duck grapplers down Spartans

The Oregon wrestlers overpowered a young San Jose State squad Wednesday night 36-7 at McArthur Court.

The Spartans were the first of four teams in three days that the Ducks will face at home. Fresno State invades tomorrow night, and Oregon State and Chico

State are on tap for a double-dual meet Friday.

The Ducks had experience on their side of the mat for a change against SJSU, a team with a first-year coach and four freshman wrestlers.

Robert Pelayo started things on a solid note by keeping his dual meet record unstained at 4-0. Pelayo, a sophomore, edged Arnold Khanbian, 5-1, at 118 pounds.

James Hawthorne whipped Andrew Flores at 126 with a 9-3 victory. The win moved Hawthorne's record to 3-8.

Glenn Jarrett came back after missing the last two meets with a knee injury to provide a wrestling technique lesson to SJSU's freshman Greg Eissner, winning 16-3.

"It's great having Glenn back," said Coach Ron Finley. "Tim Ige filled in very admirably, but Glenn is a big plus. He always wrestles the good wrestlers tough."

The Spartans got their only team points at 142 where Ken Brison topped Danny White, 19-5, for a superior decision. Brison, one of SJSU's few bright spots on their roster with a 6-1 record, caught White when the freshman was suffering from stomach cramps.

"Danny's been sick for a couple of days now. I really don't know if he'll be able to compete the rest of the week," Finley said.

Oregon's standout freshman, George Johnston, had a tough time in edging Dave Love, but outlasted the junior, 5-3, at 150 pounds.

Oregon's Vince Hochanadel evened his record at 7-7 by shutting out Spartan Shane Buam at 158, 9-0.

The night's most exciting match had to be at 167 where Oregon's Dan Martin tied SJSU's Jack Norton, 7-7. Martin stormed back to score five points in the final minute of the last period to even the score, and to shock Norton. Martin, a junior from Milwaukie, finds his record at a respectable 5-2-1.

The fixture at 177 for the Ducks is Mike Harter. The senior from New Orleans has proven he's one of the top wrestlers on the West Coast this season.

After claiming last week's Doc Peterson Tournament title in his weight class, Harter came into the Spartan match with an impressive 19-5-1 record. He added one more win by dominating a green freshman, Scott Benson, 19-3.

After giving up a default at 190, the Spartans' last hope to lessen the blowout came at the heavyweight level. Oregon's James Terry, a senior from Redmond, had other ideas. He joined Oregon's party by claiming a 12-3 win over Dirk Manoukian.

San Jose State is obviously a program in the state of rebuilding. First-year coach Danny Kida, besides wrestling four freshmen, also starts six wrestlers that have yet to win a match.

"It's a good tune-up for what we have ahead in the near future," Finley said.

The FSU Bulldogs will enter McArthur Court rated 14th nationally. The perennially strong OSU Beavers are ranked 19th in the country.

"If we're fortunate enough to beat these two teams, we should find ourselves in the top twenty," Finley said.
