set into the arches of the stage remain and are in good condition, according to a report prepared for the U.S. Interior Department, which entered the structure in the National Register of Historic Places on Aug. 26, 1982. And three of the four chandeliers are still intact, stored behind the stage.

Although the report to the interior department indicated that the theater's interior could be renovated at a reasonable cost, Weinman said the California group does not believe interior work is necessary to draw large crowds.

Film viewers don't really care if it's a nice place or a dump," Weinman said.

But the exterior work will improve the look of a corner that has undergone much change in the last year. The recently opened Downtown Athletic Club has brought more people into the area, and it appears that the one-way section of Willamette Street will be changed to allow two-way traffic, Weinman said.

"The mall wasn't working there. It was a place to hang out," Weinman said. "It's definitely a targeted area."

Renovation of the theater's facade should begin this spring.
