Women cagers keep NorPac title hopes alive

The Oregon women's basket-ball team kept their sights on the NorPac Conference title with important road victories over San Jose State University and the University of California-Berkeley over the weekend. The Ducks boosted their conference record to 7-1 and improved their season mark to 18-6.

Junior Gabi Neumann poured in a career-high 27 points, in-cluding a nine of 11 showing from the free-throw line, to lead

the Ducks past Cal 68-51, Sunday in Berkeley.

The Ducks played a zone defense for the entire game, hoping to shut down Cal's inside game. It proved to be a key

factor in the victory, as Oregon held the Bears' post-player Jen-nifer Bennett, the NorPac's second leading scorer (16.6 points per game), to only eight points on the night.

Oregon led the entire game, but the Bears managed to stay within reach in the first half by outshooting the Ducks. Cal shot 42 percent from the floor, while the Ducks connected on only 38 percent of their shots in the first

20 minutes of play.

Despite the poor shooting and a sloppy first half of action, according to Oregon coach Elwin Heiny, the Ducks established a 28-25 halftime lead.

The Ducks roared out to a commanding start after intermission, holding the Bears scoreless in the first 5:40 of the second half. Cal finally found the scoreboard, connecting on a free throw. But the lead and momentum was too much for the Bears to overcome, and Oregon cruised to yet another victory, its 17th in its last 19

Lauri Landerhelm and Amy Pettersen led Oregon with seven rebounds each.

According to Heiny, guard Tammy Richard played an excellent game, and Sue Brown

made some key first-half buckets to spark the Ducks. Ch. s Metzger, a former Oregon player, led Cal with 18

points and five rebounds.

The Ducks clobbered the SJSU Spartans, winless in conference games, 81-59, Friday in the Spartan Gym. Oregon made use of its overwhelming depth, with 11 of 12 players seeing more than 10 minutes of play-

Junior Lauri Landerholm was the only Duck to reach double figures, hitting eight of 12 shots for 17 points in just 22 minutes. Oregon's frontline players Kris Glidden, Neumann and Pettersen combined for 22 points.

hitting 10 of 16 shots. Heather McDuffie, Glidden and Pettersen all finished with six rebounds apiece.

The Ducks initiated their zone defense on the Spartans, playing it the entire game for the first time this season.

Oregon's strategy paid off, as it allowed SJSU to shoot just 38.2 percent from the field and held the Spartans leading scorer, Dana Foster, to a mere three points.

Oregon, meanwhile, shot a respectable 54 percent from the floor, hitting 34 of 63 on the

Oregon now has the week to prepare for the most important weekend of the season when it hosts Washington State University Friday night.

The Ducks will then face the University of Washington at 6 p.m. Saturday night in a showdown for the conference's automatic NCAA bid.

The Ducks squeaked past WSU on the road earlier in the season 68-67 in overtime, but fell to the Huskies 69-68 in another overtime contest.

Oregon is only one game behind the conference-leading Huskies, who top the NorPac with a perfect 7-0 record.

Gabi Neumann scored a career-high 27 points against the California Bears as the Ducks kept their NorPac title hopes alive with a pair of victories this weekend.
