

Hawks fly past the Blazers

PORTLAND, Ore. (AP) — Reserve forward Cliff Levingston stepped in for ailing all-star Dominique Wilkins and scored a game-high 25 points to lead the Atlanta Hawks to a 110-101 NBA victory over the Portland Trail Blazers Sunday.

It was the Blazers' sixth straight loss and ninth in their last 10 games.

While the Hawks played well without Wilkins, the NBA's third-leading scorer, Portland obviously missed center Sam Bowie, again benched by a bruise on his left leg.

Wilkins sprained his left knee Friday night against the Los Angeles Lakers, but the Atlanta front line Sunday accounted for 76 of the Hawks' 110 points without him.

Willis scored 21 points for Atlanta and 7-foot rookie center Jon Koncak came off the bench to score 16. Kiki Vandeweghe led Portland with 21 points, while guards Jim Paxson and Steve Colter each scored 16.

Portland led 28-25 after one quarter, but Atlanta started the second period with an 8-0 run and never was headed again.

The Blazers got within 52-51 in the third quarter before the 7-foot Willis and 6-10 reserve forward Scott Hastings asserted themselves inside to push Atlanta ahead 62-53 midway through the period. Portland got no closer than seven the rest of the way.

Atlanta Coach Mike Fratello said, "I thought we did a really good job holding them off the offensive boards and keeping them on the perimeter."

"Basketball is not wrestling and not track and field," Fratello said. "It is a team game. The difference between how we are doing this year and last has to do with how we've jelled as a cohesive team. Winning on the road against a good team like Portland, after having learned you've lost your most dominating player, has got to be just pure guts."

"This win will carry over to the rest of the season and hopefully into the playoffs," he added.

"There's a fine line between walking the ball up the court every time and taking fast breaks when you have the opportunity," Fratello said. "If you don't run at all, you're in trouble. But if you run too much, and end up with poor percentage shots, you are playing right into Portland's hands. Portland's very quick and they'll get you on the break if you pull the trigger too fast."

Coach Jack Ramsay, whose Blazers hit five of eight three-point field-goal attempts against the Hawks, said, "I don't like how we are playing. We have to work ourselves out of it. We aren't playing hard enough. We played only in spurts, like when we cut their margin down from 17 to five. We have to be able to play with that consistency throughout the game."

Bramble batters Crawley

RENO, Nev. (AP) — Livingstone Bramble battered Tyrone Crawley with strength-sapping body punches, knocked him down with a flurry to the head, and stopped him with three seconds left in the 13th round to retain the World Boxing Association lightweight championship Sunday.

Bramble, who calls himself "The Pit Bull," was just too strong and tough for the "Butterfly" from Philadelphia in the scheduled 15-round fight watched by about 2,500 in a ballroom at the MGM Grand and by an NBC-TV audience.

Bramble scored a flash knockdown about 57 seconds into the second round when he nailed Crawley with a right lead to the jaw. The challenger

touched the floor with both gloves and took a mandatory eight-count. He did not seem hurt.

But Crawley definitely was hurt when he was knocked down at about 2:25 of the 13th. Crawley had his back to the ropes near his own corner when Bramble nailed him with a short right-left to the head. Bramble followed with a flurry to the head and Crawley crashed to the canvas.

He struggled up but seemed lost. Then, after Bramble charged to attack, referee Joey Curtis quickly stepped in to stop the bout as Crawley fell to the canvas.

Immediately after the fight, it was disclosed that Bramble broke the third finger on his

right hand. The injury was thought to have occurred in the ninth or 10th round.

Bramble, known for his counterpunching, stalked Crawley throughout and showed no ill signs from a year layoff. His 24th victory, 15 by knockout against one loss and one draw, came one year to the day after he scored a unanimous 15-round decision over Ray "Boom Boom" Mancini at Reno. He now has won 17 straight fights.

The loss for Crawley snapped an eight-fight winning streak and was his second against 19 victories.

Bramble got \$213,000. Crawley's purse was \$71,000 and he earned every penny of it.


