Sports Duck gymnasts sweep Washington four-way meets

The Oregon gymnastics team started the second half of the season in style as it swept two four-way meets over the weekend in Washington.

The Ducks, who were coming off three meets in six days going into this weekend, showed no sign of fatigue as they recorded one of the biggest weekends in the history of Oregon gymnastics.

On Friday, the Ducks were in Pullman, Wash, and scored 173.15 to outdistance Stanford University. (172.3), Washington State University (141-7) and the University of California (126.05).

Saturday, Oregon moved over to Spokane and finished off the weekend sweep with victories over

Spokane Community College, Eastern Washington University and the University of Montana,

'It was a great weekend for Oregon gymnastics." said Oregon coach Ed Boyd. "We just went out and did what we knew we could do - put together a consistent meet:

Friday night's victories were a total team effort as four Ducks had all-around scores of 34.15 or above. Once again, freshman Nicky Eden led the way for Oregon.

Eden, who finished second all around in the meet with a score of 36.2, led Oregon in all four events, her top event being the floor exercise with a score of 9.25. Also pacing the Ducks Friday were Cyndee Maxwell: who had a season high score of 35 15, and Stephanie Marquett who scored 34.75

Saturday, the Ducks had to show what they were made of. While warming up for the second event, the uneven bars, Eden fell off and injured her head.

With Eden unable to compete any further, the Ducks regrouped. Captain Denise Garcia responded as she had her best meet ever as a Duck, taking first in the meet with an all-around score of 35.35-

With the six victories, the Ducks are now 14-7 and assured of their first winning season ever. More importantly, it puts the Ducks in a position to make the NCAA Western Regionals

Unofficially, the Ducks are in seventh place and are fighting with two other teams for the all-important sixth and last spot in the Western Region.




interested in participating either in the upcoming floor hockey intramural league or the floor hockey open gym nights will be held tonight in 352 Gerlinger-Annex at 6:30.


Walsh also says that, at the meeting, an open gym time will be established during which time the floor hockey equipment will be set up in 352 Gerlinger Annex for people to use.
