Pettersen grabbed 11 rebounds and Neumann collected eight caroms as the Ducks outrebounded the Huskies 41-33, an improvement over the two teams' last meeting when the shorter Washington squad managed to top Oregon in that category.

"Washington played a very tough, physical game, but we didn't let it get us down." Heiny said. "The re-bounding was pretty even in the first half because at times we weren't going for them. Fortunately, in the second half we did.

The Ducks paved the way for the Husky showdown by claiming a 94-63 rout over Washington State University on Friday night in McArthur Court.

'WSU wasn't really in top form and we were ready to show them that it wasn't our real performance in Pullman," Heiny said. "Everything we did worked and we just executed the simple things."

Oregon stormed out to an 18-2 lead in the first five minutes of the contest and never looked back. The lead grew to as much as 28 in the first half.

The rest of the game told the same story as the Ducks destroyed a team that they narrowly defeated on the road, 68-67, in overtime.

Landerholm claimed high scoring honors, pouring in 22 points, 18 of which she scored in the first half. Neumann, Pettersen and Sheila Sattiewhite all hit double figures as well, chipping in 11 points apiece.

The Ducks now prepare themselves for their final two games of the regular season, both of which are very important in terms of keeping their hands on the conference lead.

Oregon travels to Fresno State University on Saturday and then returns home to host Oregon State University on March 5.
