Wrestlers head to Pac-10 meet

The Oregon wrestlers realistically do not expect to win Sunday's Pacific-10 Conference championship meet in Pullman, Wash.

In fact, Oregon coach Ron Finley thinks it will be an Oregon-Stanford duel to stay out of the cellar.

The cellar, however, isn't as bad as it might sound. Only five schools in the conference have wrestling programs.

Heading the pack is Oregon State University and Arizona State University, who both have been ranked in the top twenty nationally throughout most of the year. Washington State University and Stanford also have solid teams, and both have posted wins over the Ducks this season.

"I think it will be a toss-up between OSU and Arizona State," Finley says. "Washington State should finish third. We will battle with Stanford for fourth."

Still, the conference championships are mostly for the individual wrestlers trying to

make it to Iowa City, Iowa and the NCAA finals. It takes a firstor second-place finish to win the trip to nationals March 13-15.

Oregon's best chances ride with senior Mike Harter, who is 33-7-1 at 177 pounds, and sophomore Glenn Jarrett at 134 with a record of 25-13.

"Harter and Jarrett have real good shots at qualifying for nationals," Finley says. "Roberto Pelayo at 118 pounds and Shon Lewis at 126 could also surprise. some people, but both are in very tough divisions."

Pelayo, a sophomore, owns an even 13-13 record while the freshman Lewis stands at 15-10.

George Johnston, Oregon's freshman at 150 pounds, has been battling injuries for the last part of the season. He will give it a go Sunday, but the Oregon City wrestler may have to wait until next year for a conference-

Regardless of the Pac-10 meet outcome. Finley has been pleased with the season in which the Ducks finished 7-11 in dual

"We've come a long way

from last year." Finley says. "We have come close in duals with some very competitive teams.'

After Sunday, some Ducks may have even farther to go all the way to Iowa City.

The Oregon gymnestics team swings back into action tonight after a 10-day lay-off as it plays host to Seattle Pacific University in Gerlinger Annex at 7 p.m.

The Ducks, who are coming off six wins last week in Washington, take on the NCAA Division Ills top-rated team.

"They are as good as any Division I team," Oregon coache Ed Boyd says. "I'm sure they could easily be in the Division I team, the start of the start o

Earlier this season, Oregon fell 1.45 points short of upending Seattle Pacific in the Washington Open as the Ducks had to settle for second place.

"Opens are different than single meets because you are not as pressured as a team to perform." Boyd says. "In head-to-head competition though, you need to hit each event cleaner or the scores will reflect it."

Oregon is fighting for the sixth and final spot in the NCAA Western Regional race. The Ducks need to improve their team average in scoring in hopes of making the regionals. The way the regionals are determined is by the top

regionals. The way the regionals are determined is by the top six team scoring averages, and currently the Ducks are averaging 170.8 a meet and are unofficially tied with two other teams for the sixth spot.

The Ducks, who are 14-7 for the season, look as though they are in a great position to make the regionals as they head into the final two weeks of the season. They have their final three meets at home and everyone is healthy.

"Our goal for this meet is to improve our home score." Boyds says. "So far we haven't gotten the scores we would like to score at home."


