protegee. "When I first got here, I didn't know anybody, so what did I do but hang around my coach 24 hours a day." Basile savs.

Basile is Brym's highestranking gymnast and is also the oldest of the 17 others on the team. Brym, 33, says it is often strange for her to discipline a 19-year-old and adds, with a laugh, that Basile still needs to be told what to do.

"You want to be independent and now somebody's in your life telling you what you have to eat and what you have to lose. and 'I want you to do this. and I don't want you to do that,' Brym says.

But they agree that the work comes from a combined effort. "I am just so lucky to have someone like Kathy, as good as she is, coaching me," Basile Savs. what I do. It is a genuine interest."


For Brym, coaching is just as demanding as training. During a competition, Brym shares in the agonies and victories of her students.


"I have a really hard time watching," she says. "I think every coach goes through that - you just sit there and you're doing the routine with them. but you can't do anything about it.'
