# Ducks qualify at Pepsi Relays

This year, the Oregon-Pepsi Relays were a smaller version of what they have been in their three-year history — the high-school sections, the two-day format and a number of relays have been eliminated. The excitement, however, has remained, and a couple of events have been added.

One of the additions is the men's 800 meters race.

Jose Barbosa probably appreciates that addition. His winning time in the 800 was 1:46.84, which is the fastest time in the world this year and a Lane Community College record for the 1984 Brazilian Olympian.

Also thankful for a good day of running were four Oregon men who qualified for the NCAA championships to be held June 4-10 in Indianapolis, Ind.

Dub Myers was the first of the four to qualify, winning the 1,500 meters in 3:40.76. The race was enhanced by the late entry of Oklahoma State's Paul Larkins, the NCAA indoor-mile champion. Larkins decided to race in Eugene rather than at a meet in Wichita, Kan., because he thought it would be too hot there to run well and only arrived in Eugene Saturday afternoon.

Larkins led from the start until 250 meters remained, when Myers put on a big move and passed him. As Myers came down the homestretch, Larkins and Athletics West's Vince Draddy were immediately behind. Larkins got as close as Myer's shoulder, finishing second in 3:40.81, with Draddy third in 3:41.33.

"Never underestimate anybody," Meyers said. "I was a lot happier about this when I knew it was going to be fast. I got more nervous about it. Today felt much more like a race than most."

The men's 5,000 meters was a race of about 13 runners to the very end. The top 12 all broke

14 minutes and three Ducks qualified for NCAAs. Harold Kuphardt, Rick Bergeson and Knut Hegvold finished fifth, sixth and eighth in times that were all big improvements.

Kuphardt's time of 13:49.3 was a personal best by more than 20 seconds. Bergeson ran 13:51.28, a 15-second improvement, and Hegvold, running his first 5,000 in two years, improved by more than 30 seconds to 13:53.58. John Strickland, who was 13th, ran 14:10, a personal best by 12 seconds.

Two runners who did not get much of a race were Claudette Groenendaal in the 800 meters and Oklahoma State's Christine McMiken in the 3,000 meters.

Groenendaal, the former Duck who now runs for Athletics West, won her race in a meet record 2:03.45.

McMiken also set a meet record, leading from the gun and running 9:03.32.

Oregon women's head coach Tom Heinonen was pleased with his athletes' performances. They had five lifetime bests, 13 seasonal bests and a TAC qualifier in redshirt Camille Harding, who won the heptathlon.

Heinonen emphasized that he was not upset more Ducks had not qualified for NCAAs. He felt before the season the number would be small this year. The future, however, looks bright.

Yvette Brown won the discus in the morning section of the meet with a five-foot improvement in her personal best to 161-2. That indicates a good chance of her reaching the NCAA qualifying mark of 168-6.

Monica Beemer also got a big personal best, improving in the javelin by 14 feet to 163-4. Heinonen was also pleased with the performances of two of his freshmen 800-meter runners, Francie Faure, who has been bothered with nagging injuries, ran 2:08.43 in the morning section, and Colleen Quam ran 2:08.74 in the night race, both personal bests.

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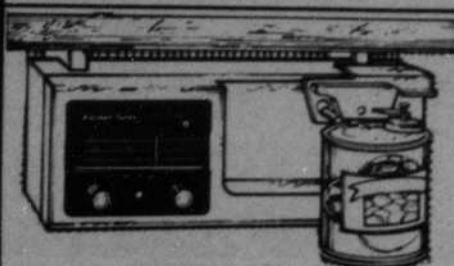
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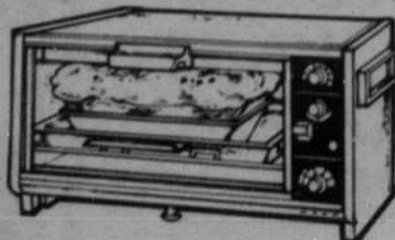
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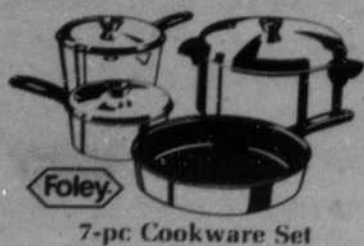
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
