# New building planned for Museum of Natural History

Plans for construction and fund raising for the Museum of Natural History's new building were announced Tuesday by University officials. The structure will be built at the site of a parking lot across from the

The \$635,000 project is part of a \$45 million program to build new science facilities on campus. The present museum, located next to the Science Library, is to be razed to make room for two new science buildings.

The new museum will be an ll,000-square-foot building with a 9,100-square-foot courtyard. Museum Director Don Dumond said the new structure will "just about duplicate the present facility sizewise, but it will have more elegance and more storage room.

Another advantage of the new building is that the staff will have better control of temperature and humidity, which are important in preserving artifacts, Dumond said.

Of the money needed for the construction, \$485,000 will come from an \$8.1 million grant from the Department of Energy for the first phase of the University's science construction project. That leaves \$150,000, of which \$77,500 has been raised. Bill Bowerman, former University head track coach, has donated \$55,000, and Portland philanthropist Tom Autzen has given \$22,500.

The remaining \$72,500 must be raised by late summer when construction is expected to begin. Dumond said he did not know when the bid would be awarded, but he expected ground to be broken in September and the museum to be moved to the new site in a year.

The museum houses the Oregon State Museum of Anthropology collections and the Thomas Condon Geology Collection. Condon was a 19th-century paleontologist and founding member of the University. Paleontology is the study of fossils.

About 20,000 people visit the museum each year, Dumond said. He said he did not know whether attendance would improve after the move, but added "many people give up because they can't find the place."

University Planner Fred Tepfer said displacement of parking spaces caused by the construction should not be a problem. "There should be no significant loss of parking."

University officials have said they can make up for any lost spaces by restructuring the lot to make it more efficient and by replacing the parallel parking on Columbia Street with slanted spaces.
