

delinquent with as much personality as brains. How Joey's sister Annie can fall out of his arms and into bed after a few minutes (spent bickering) is another great mystery — Annie comes off looking much smarter than that.

If there has to be one reason our heroes can stay alive, it must be Kerch's stupidity. If he knew Turner and Annie were an item (and he does), why didn't he strike earlier? How did he miss finding his best friend Joey? And how could anyone allow two armed men to take an entire casino and practically level it?

Manning simply rushes from one high point to the other, trying to make a film that maintains one long climax without build-up.

"Blue City" is the film Walter Hill should have this year, not the disappointing "Crossroads." Under his firm hand this could have been a gritty, fast paced actioner done in style. Manning's style is limited to a basic veneer of surface gloss without any sense of narrative or structure. "Blue City" is probably a pretty good story, but the results are too disappointing.




