Dear Mom & Dad

I have found a way to make the next two or three years more profitable for both of us. A senior is managing 17 rental units. He lives in a nice cottage 1/2 block from campus. The owners, his parents, pay him a 7% management fee. They also pay him for maintenance and repairs. This covers his rent and utilities and it's all deductible expense for the owner. The owners also deduct interest, depreciation, and other expenses enough to shelter the rental income plus about \$20 thousand of their other income.

The owners enjoy tax shelter, equity gains and capital gains when they sell. Packwood's tax plan could affect some of this but it probably would still be profitable. And it would give us valuable experience in real estate, where a lot of fortunes are made.

The property is available next September with assumable mortgages. You could call and discuss it with the owners. They are not realtors. Then they could meet you in Eugene to look at the property and the figures. (Your trip would be deductible.) I hope you'll give them a call (716-223-4443).
