

Scholarship service offers financial aid information

Valuable information about financial aid opportunities is just a phone call away through The Scholarship Bank, a Los Angeles-based scholarship information distribution service.

More than \$500 million in private financial aid is available

to students in the form of scholarships, grants, summer internships and loans, says Director Steve Danz. The average amount of each loan is more than \$1,000, Danz said.

Information on 2,500 summer internships is available to

qualified students, he said.

Students may qualify for aid on the basis of their major, occupational goals, geographic preferences, type of aid requested, religion, parents' union and military or employment background.

Students receive applications by completing a questionnaire. The top 65 opportunities are then determined by computer, and a printout is sent to the student along with the applications, Danz said.

Consideration is also given to

students who are willing to enter competitions or conduct research at an institution, Danz said. Numerous grants are given by trade groups and corporations to students with a specific major or an expressed willingness to work for the institution after graduation, he said.

Many corporations are providing funds for women who are returning to school, Danz said.

Other funding is received from Ford, General Motors, the

American Bar Association and the National Association of Student Nurses.

The Scholarship Bank charges a \$40 service fee, but Danz said students may send for information on a two-for-one basis with another person to split the cost.

Although the deadline has passed for some of the aid opportunities, information on many of the programs for next year is still available. Interested students should call 1-800-332-4432 for information.
