### International Post office bombed

TEL AVIV, Israel (AP) — A small bomb exploded Sunday at a post office in the Mediterranean port city of Ashdod, slightly wounding a postal worker, police said.

A police spokesman said the explosives appeared to have been planted by Palestinian guerrillas. Israel army radio said police rounded up 20 Arab suspects for questioning.

The injured woman was released after being given first aid, the spokesman said. Ashdod is 20 miles south of Tel Aviv.

### Bombs rock town

JOHANNESBURG, South Africa (AP) — Three bomb explosions rocked Durban within hours of each other, one starting an oil refinery blaze early Sunday and polluting an exclusive Indian Ocean yacht club and surrounding sea.

No casualties were reported in the Durban explosions — one outside a downtown movie house, one at a chemical plant south of the city and one at the nearby Durban oil refinery, starting a blaze that raged for two hours near giant fuel storage depots surrounding the complex.

The blasts came a week after a car bomb outside a hotel on Durban's Marine Parade beachfront boulevard killed three women, two whites and an Indian, and wounded 69 people.

#### New envoy arrives

WASHINGTON (AP) — As President Reagan prepares for a handshake with new Soviet Ambassador Yuri Dubinin Monday, administration officials are voicing a "wait and see" attitude on progress toward a U.S.-Soviet summit this year.

Dubinin, returning from consultations in Moscow, will join other ambassadors in formally presenting diplomatic creden-

tials to Reagan in the Oval Office.

Although the meeting is a formality, there has been speculation that Dubinin may bring a Soviet response to Reagan's latest effort to get summit preparations back on track.

#### Student released

SAN DIEGO (AP) — A college student who was jailed for four days in South Africa after crusading for an end to apartheid has arrived home, but says he would like to return there to continue working against racial separation.

Scott Daugherty, 19, said he didn't think he'd ever get out of the Cape Town jail after he and more than 200 others were arrested when police raided a church June 15. He was released four days later.

#### Gas prices plunge

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Motorists willing to pump their own gasoline are paying less than 90 cents a gallon, and prices will continue to fall this week in an unprecedented pre-Fourth of July plunge, an oil industry analyst said Sunday.

"It is an amazing drop," Dan Lundberg said after tabulating results of his twice-monthly 50-state survey of 17,000 gasoline stations. "It is sort of an Arabian summer in early bloom."

#### Statue 'abducted'

DOVER TOWNSHIP, N.J. (AP) — A 7-foot plastic statue of Ronald McDonald swiped from a McDonald's restaurant is being held for ransom in an elaborate plot complete with anonymous letters and photographs of the, uh, victim.

The abductors aren't after just chickenfeed. They want 8,891 chicken McNuggets.

#### Deaths reviewed

SEATTLE (AP) — County

medical officials said Sunday that they would review unusual deaths that have occurred since January as part of the investigation into two deaths caused by cyanide-laced capsules of Extra-Strength Excedrin.

Corrine Fligner, the King County medical examiner, said the review would focus on deaths in the southern part of the county, where the two cyanide victims lived, as well as deaths that had been ruled natural but that were unusual — such as sudden deaths of people in relatively good health.

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
