

Taylor's Bayou Kitchen shuts down

The Bayou Kitchen, popular home of Creole cooking in Eugene for the last 15 months, has closed.

Gavin "Rooster" Fox, co-manager and cook for the Kitchen since its opening at Taylor's Tavern, said the end "was nothing exciting. Our lease agreement simply came to term."

"Ray (Varner, the other co-manager) has another project he's working on — a club in Seattle. If it happens, it'll be another food and blues venue, with a hard (liquor) bar. It will be multilevel, and there will be card playing because it's outside the city limits, and so gambling is legal," he said.

"Cards and the blues do go together," he added.

Fox will continue to work at Taylor's, home of the Monday night Blues Jam, an eight-year tradition in Eugene. He and Varner have co-hosted the Jam since its inception, and will continue to do so, he said.

"We want to express our appreciation for the support our patrons have given us. We really enjoyed cooking real food for you," Fox said.

"It's not out of the question that the Bayou Kitchen may open up in another venue," he added.

"It could be in the cards," he said.

But Frank Brawner, executive director of the Oregon Banking Association, disagrees.

"This is absolutely incorrect," he said. "Our studies indicate... and they are factual... that three or four checks in 10,000 have any holds on them."

Most banks give customers immediate access to their money, Brawner said. A check-holding policy is used only when a check is oversized, drawn from an out-of-area institution or if the customer is new, he said.

The law requires all banks, savings and loans, and credit unions doing business in the state to display their holding policies in a public area within the institution.

According to OSPIRG's study, 41 percent of the institutions surveyed are not complying with the law. In addition, of the banks that do comply, a majority use unclear language when discussing policies, Bissonnette said.

But Brawner said, "This is totally false."

The report fails to point out that the law applies to credit

unions and savings and loans, as well as banks, Brawner said. Many credit unions have not complied with the law, while only about 10 banks have not, he said. All banks are now in compliance, he added.

"The report should have been entitled 'Held up at the Credit Union,'" he said. "We have made every effort to be in compliance."

The report also charges that state interest rates on bank-issued credit cards are unusually high. Consumers pay 19.8 percent, Bissonnette said, a rate that used to be called usury, which means lending at excessive rates.

"Oregon should follow the example of the state of Arkansas," he said. Arkansas law allows a maximum credit card rate of five percent above the current treasury bill rate, he said. If Oregon followed this, its rate would be 12 percent instead of 19.8 percent, he said.

Brawner said many of the figures in OSPIRG's report are national figures and have no application to Oregon. Many banks allow a 45-day grace period on bank-issued credit

cards, and studies show that 60 percent of all Oregonians pay no interest because their accounts are paid on time, he said.

The report recommends setting a specific limit on how long banks can hold checks — one business day for local checks, two for non-local, in-state checks and four for out-of-state checks.

It also recommends that banking regulators require banks to immediately comply with the disclosure law, and that the Oregon legislature pass legislation to set a ceiling on the annual fee charged for bank cards. A mean average of \$15 would be reasonable, it says.

"By passing these recommendations, Oregon will have the advantage of fairer banking practices," Bissonnette said.

But Brawner disagrees. "We have a competitive marketplace that works very well," he said. "Our annual fees are not out of line."
