Program provides a look at science

A small group of high school students currently is exploring the world of science at the University through the Oregon Summer Science Experience.

Gordon Murphy, a University biology professor and the program's director, set up the program five years ago in an attempt to "convince young students that science is a viable career option."

Mike Bailey, a participant from The Dalles High School, would like to explore all areas of science, although he finds astronomy and physics the most interesting, he said.

Being around other students with the same interests has been a valuable part of the program, he said.

"It's great to be here and to be able to talk about things after the different activities," he said. "We all know a little bit about something in the field of science."

Huong Phan, a junior from St. Mary of the Valley High School, said the program has of-

fered her more insight into what field of science she wants to enter upon graduation.

The students spend two weeks involved in a variety of activities, both social and academic, Murphy said. They recently took a weekend trip to the Oregon Institute of Marine Biology, he said.

Students attend lectures and labs taught by University professors during the day, he said.

The students do not take exams or read textbooks — they learn about science through participation, Murphy said.

The students are selected based on high school transcripts and letters of recommendation, said Korri Kanoff from Dallas High School.

Students pay their own way as well as provide their own transportation, Murphy said. Most of the students are residents of Oregon, although three students are from out of state, he said.

Student interns research, study international trade

Two University students are spending the summer learning about international trade. Terri Zimmerman, a junior Japanese major, and Colleen Pang, an international business graduate student, are two of 14 students chosen from Oregon universities for the International Trade Intern Program at Portland State University.

"I was looking for an internship because trying to learn about international trade just through classes is like trying to learn to swim out of a book," Zimmerman said.

Upon graduation, Zimmerman hopes to work in the area of international trade and transportation, specifically freight forwarding, she said.

"Freight forwarding is kind of like trying to be a travel agent for cargo instead of people," Zimmerman said.

The program, conducted by the PSU International Trade and Commerce Institute, was established two years ago, said Eric Tinus, assistant coordinator of the program. The 10-week program emphasizes educating students about their role in promoting Oregon commerce abroad, he said.

"The goal of the program is to provide information about international trade and commerce in the Northwest," he said.

The interns participate in seminars and lectures presented by professionals in the business of international trade, Zimmerman said.

"I think that this is valuable because in the international

trade business, you have to get involved and know the right people," she said.

As part of the internship, all students are required to prepare research projects to be presented at the end of the term, Tinus said.

"We encourage students to look at their own career interests when choosing a project," he said.

Zimmerman is researching an Oregon winery that is attempting to export its wine coolers to Japan, she said.

The project involves looking into the winery's history, finding out how the product has sold previously in Japan and deciding what marketing strategies to implement, she said.

Pang, who has traveled to China and parts of Asia, said she is using her international experience to help with her research project. She is studying an electronics firm in Beaverton that has a contract with China to market test instruments.

"This project, as well as the program as a whole, has really opened my eyes to all of the possibilities in the field," Zimmerman said. "both careerwise and with things happening on the Oregon Coast."

Students interested in the program submit applications to sponsoring professors, who then turn the applications over to the program, Tinus said.

"We are looking for students with a strong academic background as well as a background in both business and international studies," he said.
