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## Teens perfect computer skills

A workshop at the University this week is helping teen-agers sharpen their computer skills.

"This is an enrichment and enhancement program for kids who have already had some exposure to computers," said Computer Camp Director Eric Schiff.

Schiff said knowledge gained at the camp will give participants an advantage over their peers.

"No matter what career these kids go into, they will be using computers," Schiff said.

The participants receive four hours of instruction every morning, along with one hour on a computer and one hour on design work, Schiff said.

Matt Schantzen, a 12-year-old participant from Gresham, Oregon, is constructing a required slide show on an Apple computer. His project will include seven frames of simulated air combat, he said.

He became interested in computers three years ago when his family purchased a home computer, he said.

Dawn Bishop, a 12-year-old from Drewsey, Oregon, began using computers at school three years ago.

"I enjoy using the computers for art work," she said.

Schiff, a computer science instructor at Jefferson Middle School, has directed the camp since it started four years ago.

The camp will travel to the Oregon Coast, the Marine Science Center and the Willamette Science & Technology Center, with each activity tying into computer use, Schiff said.

The 14 participants range in age from 11 to 14 and come from throughout the Northwest, Schiff said. Cost for the one-week program is \$475 and includes room and board in the dormitories.

The camp runs from July 26 to Aug. 2 and is sponsored by the University Continuation Center. The center often runs workshops and conferences that assist the community, said Ann Moore, continuation education coordinator.
