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permit, Rowe said.

"The purpose of it is to provide some opportunity for the Athletic Department to give a visible demonstration of what the proposal would be like, to see whether or not it in fact works," Rowe said.

Committee members decided a proposal by architecture student Erin Shilliday to move the 13th Avenue and Kincaid Street bus shelter to the quad between Villard and Lawrence halls wouldn't work.

The bus shelter was part of the 1970s Oregon Experiment, which promoted the efficient use of existing campus

buildings along with small scale construction such as the bus shelter, Shilliday said.

"In my mind, it seems to be a fairly physical monument of the Oregon Experiment, which some people think has failed, or died, or is no longer in existence, but it's not," he said. "It's a very interesting piece of the experiment."

Shilliday said his proposal to move the shelter to the quad would allow students to use it as an informal classroom or study area, but the combination of the building's appearance and the proposed construction

site near buildings like Villard Hall brought strong opposition from committee members.

"It just doesn't seem to me to fit stylistically, aesthetically," said committee member Paul Holbo.

Wilmot Gilland, dean of the School of Architecture and Allied Arts, said the bus shelter's deterioration would prohibit its longevity.

"I think this is a structure that has served its purpose," he said.

Shilliday said he wasn't surprised at the committee's rejection of his proposal, and said he was more interested in the building's preservation than the site location.

In regard to the shelter's attractiveness, Shilliday said, "The Eiffel Tower was hated when it was built."
