University gets chance to brag through its Expo '86 display

Millions of people will have the opportunity to scrutinize the University through the eye of a lens Sunday at Expo '86 in Vancouver, B.C.

Charlene Curry, director of University governmental relations, will depart Friday morning for Expo to set up Sunday's exhibit in the Oregon Pavilion.

"It's a brag opportunity," Curry said. "It's bragging about the quality of education on campus, the beauty of the campus, the quality of research here and the University's contribution to the economy of the state of Oregon."

The University exhibit is made up of about 25 color photographs. Included in the exhibit are photos of the University Museum of Art, Deady Hall, an aerial view of a crowd-filled Autzen Stadium and ducks on the Millrace.

The photos are meant to portray the quality and diversity of University degree programs, research, equipment and the increase in the amount of research dollars, Curry said.

The University exhibit is part of the Southern Willamette Research Corridor exhibit that will be on display Aug. 9-14, Curry said. Other members of the SWRC include Lane Community College, Oregon State University, Linn-Benton Community College, the cities of Eugene, Springfield, Junction City, Corvallis and Albany, and four economic development partnerships located in those communities, she said.

The SWRC exhibit booth will change its primary focus to a different partner each day, beginning Saturday with OSU and LBCC, Curry said. The University and LCC exhibit will be featured Sunday and will be followed on consecutive days by the Eugene, Springfield, Albany and Corvallis exhibits, she said.

The purpose of the corridor is to "build awareness of the assets located in the southern Willamette Valley with an emphasis on the research and technician training aspects," Curry said.

Curry, who is serving as overall coordinator for the SWRC booth, became involved

with the project in late December when she was appointed to a blue-ribbon task force by the mayors of Eugene and Springfield, she said.

The primary goal of the task force was to decide "how to pull people off I-5 on their way to Expo," Curry said. The other goal was to decide whether the community should do something at the Expo itself, she said.

Curry began talking to other members of the corridor and found that most had an interest in doing something for Expo. The partners decided to pool their resources and reserve six days for their booth at the Oregon Pavilion, thereby avoiding the one-day per city restriction, Curry said. In this way, each member of the corridor would be the primary focus for one day but also would be a secondary focus for five other days, she said.

Margie Sherman, Curry's assistant, took care of the logistics of the trip, including ongoing communication with pavilion officials and arranging room and board for the delegation.

About 31 people from the SWRC, including Eugene Mayor Brian Obie, will staff the booth throughout its one-week run at Expo, Curry said.

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
