Ducks lose fourth straight

The sun may have been shining in Eugene Saturday, but the clouds continued to loom over the Oregon football team as it succumbed to 15th-ranked Arizona State University 37-17, losing its fourth straight game.

The Ducks, 0-3 in Pacific-10 Conference action and 2-4 on the season, once again had the opportunities but failed to capitalize.

Trailing 14-10 late in the second quarter, Oregon came up empty-handed after driving 68 yards to the Arizona 14. Failing to convert this drive may have been the single most important

key to Oregon's loss.

After tailback Latin Berry scampered 37 yards on a shifty swinging gait play that easily put Oregon in scoring position at the Arizona 19, the Ducks threatened to put some points on the board and possibly even snatch the lead from ASU.

Unfortunately, a crucial delay of game penalty and a Sun Devil interception in the end zone put a damper on the Ducks' effort to establish momentum in the game.

"We had our chance down there when we ran the swinging gait, but wouldn't you know...our 25-second clock doesn't work and we get a delay

of the game penalty that I know we're not going to get with Miller staring it in the face," said head coach Rich Brooks. "We don't get any points out of that drive, and I think it was a crucial possession for a little bit of momentum we might have had going our way at that point in the game."

When the Ducks failed to convert the drive, ASU took the reins with 3:43 left in the half and marched up the field 80 yards in 10 plays for a touchdown that all but buried the Ducks.

"In a situation where we could have taken the lead 17-14 and instead we come away with nothing, and they (ASU) come down and march before the half and get their touchdown—That really hurt us," Brooks said.

The Sun Devils made the most of two Oregon penalties and a 21-yard completion from quarterback Jeff Van Raaphorst to Tony Johnson before Van Raaphorst connected with flanker Bruce Hill for the score from 18 yards out and a 20-10 cushion at halftime.

ASU used a balanced game plan against the Ducks, chalking up 492 yards total offense (248 yards rushing and 244 yards passing).

Tailback Paul Day and fullback Channing Williams plowed over the Ducks' defense for 91 and 94 yards on the ground, respectively. Van Raaphorst countered ASU's running game, completing 13 of 18 passes for 244 yards and three touchdowns.

Oregon quarterback Chris Miller enjoyed a field day himself, completing 21 of 37 aerials for 269 yards, moving him to the 10th spot on the all-time Pac-10 passing and total yardage lists.

Miller didn't throw for a touchdown, but he caught one at the end of the first quarter on a pass from Derek Loville that made it 14-10.

ASU was the first to light up

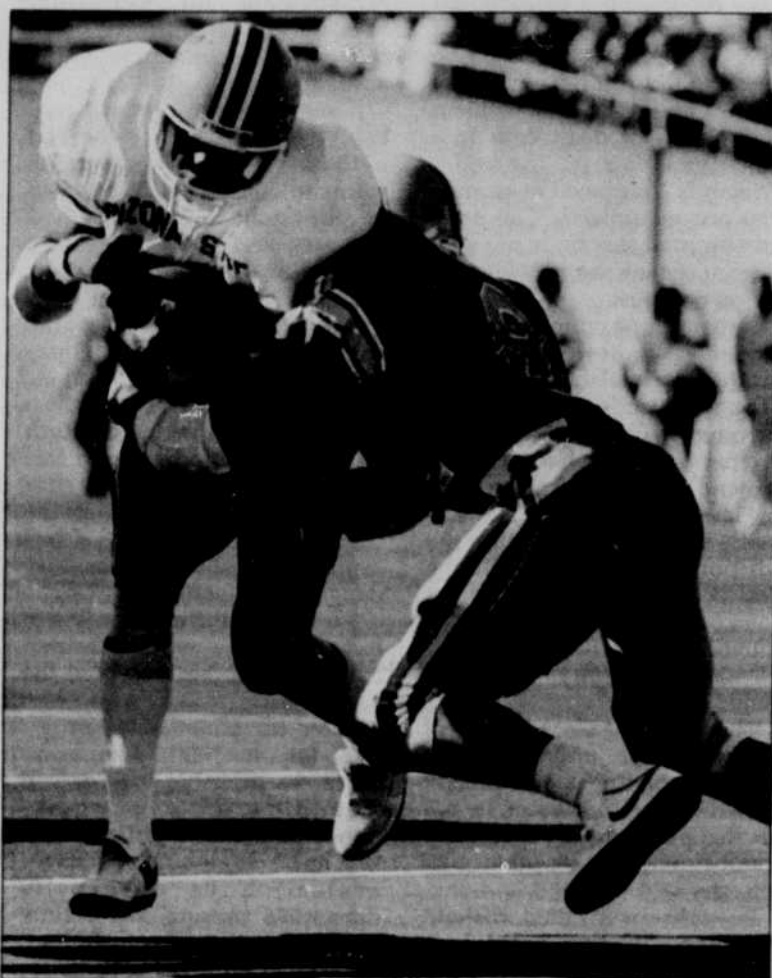
