# Foundation promotes excellence in students

The Student Activities Resource Office (SARO) and members of the community are working together to promote excellence among college students.

The 1440 Foundation, a local non-profit, tax-exempt group whose goal is to perpetuate excellence in people. is an organizer of the "Celebrate Excellence 1986" program.

The foundation is working with the University to promote student leadership and personal excellence, said President Gary McNaught.

The speakers were chosen because the couple has achieved excellence as speakers, authors and business owners.
