Cowvallis turns more whiter

In a move that surprised no one, the Cowvallis City Council Thursday night decreed the color white as the town color.

"George Washington was white, the clouds in the sky are white and so are the eyes of our football players," reasoned Mayor Wallace George. "It's about time we recognized our heritage."

At the outset of the council meeting, Cowvallis City Council member Junior Birch revealed the results of a survey that showed 98 percent of Cowvallis residents thought white was a good color.

"That tells you a lot about the people here," Birch said. "Shows you what kind of solid upbringing they've had. Makes you kind of proud to walk the streets."

"The color white represents clean, wholesome living. It's a God-given color," Birch added.

In accordance with the decree, certain measures will go into effect. All streets and sidewalks within Cowvallis will be painted

white, signs with the words, "This is whiteless free zone," will be posted at all entrances to the town and the wearing of white shoes will be enforced.
