Netters lose in first round

The Stanford Cardinal, led by a quick middle attack and a stingy defense, put an end to Oregon's dream season Saturday, with a 15-9, 15-7, 10-15, 15-4 NCAA tournament victory in McArthur Court.

The Cardinal, 21-9 and rank-

ed 11th, will now advance to the West Regional, while the Ducks, who finished their season at 22-11 and ranked 15th, will have to wait until next year.

Stanford used the triple threat combination of Teresa Smith, Nancy Reno and Barbra Fontana to defuse the Ducks. The three

combined for 65 of Stanford's 78 kills and 49 digs — only three less than the whole Oregon team.

"Stanford played great defense . . . their block was a factor and they did a nice job stuffing us," said a disappointed Oregon coach Gerry Gregory.
