Oregon notches third straight with win over Seattle-Pacific

In spite of lingering memories of Idaho State in the first half of Saturday's game with Seattle-Pacific University, the Ducks came out in the second half and did what they were supposed to do — beat a Division II club, 85-68, in McArthur Court.

The Falcons took advantage of 13 Oregon first-half fouls and made 16 of 19 from the charity stripe to keep them in the game.
