

LIB 127 USE OF THE LIBRARY (3) Frantz, 264 Main Library

The course will acquaint students with the materials and services the library offers. The students will learn how these materials are organized and, most importantly, will learn strategies on how to use these materials most efficiently for the research they will do while at the University.

Special attention is paid to the U. of O. Library, but the principles learned may be applied to other

research libraries as well.

COMMENTS: Regular attendance is important. The 80-minute class sessions will be divided between lecture and discussion, and lab sessions, in which students will complete exercises that test their ability to use the library. The course culminates in a major research project.
