

on the trip was to manufacture classical guitars in China using wood from Oregon, Rust said. Down to Earth, a local business which sells kitchen and gardening supplies, also signed contracts for Chinese household goods and cutlery to be sold in the store.

"Once you start this business of international trade, then it's up to the entrepreneurs to keep it going," Rust said. "This was a very small, but I think a very significant effort to secure the China trade," Rust said.

Comrada represented the

University during the exchange, contacting the presidents of three different universities in the Fujian. In addition, Comrada brought materials and gifts to Chinese families of students who are in Oregon.

"We don't know what's going to happen in the future, but we're trying to lay the groundwork," Comrada said. "They already know we're interested."

"It's a very ancient and complex culture...we seem like

new kids," Comrada said.

Others in the group included musician John Doan, an instructor at Willamette University; musician Robert Fous, the marketing director for East Earth Herbs, and Jack Bates, president of Down to Earth.

The group documented the trip with over 1,000 slides and seven hours of video tape, which they hope can be used for educational purposes. Rust also hopes to give discussions and slide shows for campus and community groups, he said.

"It's relaxing in the sense that there's no pressure on me, but I feel like I'm doing it for me now and not for the school, which is better," said senior Rex Watkins, one of seven holdovers from the varsity squad.

Eileen Loveless, a junior art history major, especially recognizes the different attitude. She is here on a National Student Exchange program from Rutgers University in New Jersey, where she competes for the women's swim team.

"It's a big difference from a regimented program where they own me as an athlete, and I don't have any freedom. I have so much freedom here and it's much more relaxed and fun," said Loveless. "I think Vanner is a very good coach. I get more attention from him in a loose program than I do from my coach."

"I've been swimming in a lot of competitions here, and I've been able to get down and do some pretty decent times under a relaxed program," she added.

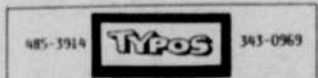
