OSU shuts down Oregon, captures Civil War 71-63

If the Oregon men's basketball team had a game plan against Oregon State University Saturday, they sure didn't follow it.

The Beavers used sound defense and dominated the offensive boards to upend the Ducks, 71-63, in a Pacific 10 Conference, Civil War matchup at Corvallis' Gill Coliseum.

The win enables the Beavers to improve their Pac-10 record to 3-2 (10-3 overall) and drops the Ducks to 2-3 (8-6 overall).

"I think more than anything I'd give credit to Oregon State. They out-toughed us, they were more aggressive. I guess it appeared to me that they wanted it more," said Oregon coach Don Monson.

OSU was certainly tougher in many aspects of the game, but the most significant killer for the Ducks was the rebounding department. The statistics show that the Beavers only out-rebounded Oregon by one, 30-29, but the offensive boards were another story.

Oregon State sent everyone crashing to the boards and came away with 13 second opportunities, compared to just six for the Ducks. Rebounding has been a topic of interest in Oregon practices, so being beat in this department was particularly painful.

"It hurts a little worse because we've been working on it," said Oregon forward Keith Balderston, who could only manage three rebounds in 29 minutes of action. "They're trying to ingrain into our heads that we have to rebound to win, and then we don't do the job on the boards."

"They probably wanted it more than we did," said Duck center Sven Meyer. "I went up for the boards and they were everywhere — to the left, to the right, behind me."

Regardless of the lack of rebounding or Oregon's 20 turnovers, the Ducks were still in this game — and led for a period late in the second half — thanks mostly to a phenomenal performance by Anthony Taylor. The 6-foot-4 guard was the only active member of the Oregon offense as he negotiated the tough OSU defense for a game-high 26 points.

It was his three straight free throws off a foul and technical

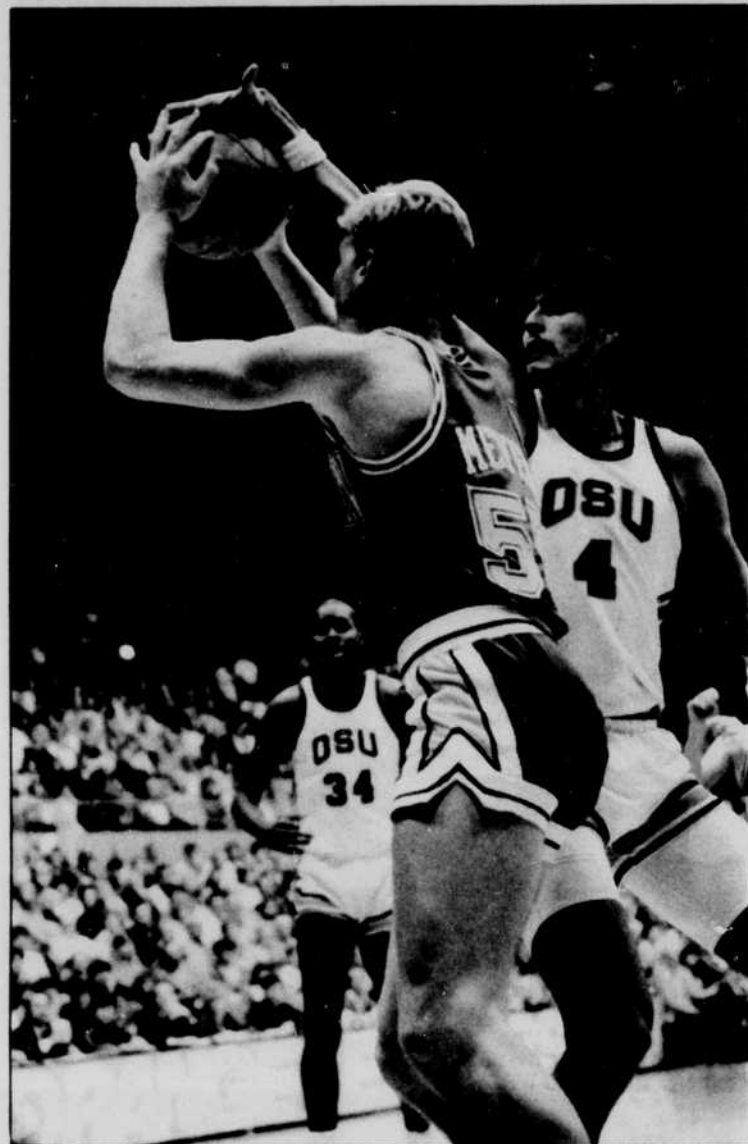

on OSU's Bill Sherwood that gave Oregon only their third lead of the game with just 7:42 to go, 54-53.

But most of the 9,746 fans pulled behind the Beavers, and center Jose Ortiz responded with a steal and coast-to-coast drive to regain the lead at 55-54.

Taylor then got the roll on a jumper and another score off the assist from Girley, and Oregon was looking at its second straight win over the Beavers, 58-55, with just 5:19 left.

The Beavers dug deep and rattled off nine straight points to break Oregon's back, but the Ducks certainly helped the streak along. Taylor slipped after a rebound on a possession that could have the Ducks a five-point cushion. Instead, OSU's Gary Payton hit Eric

Knox coming off a great screen on the inbounds pass, and he laid it in to close the gap at 58-57.

The Ducks' offense then sputtered and fell victim to three straight steals, and OSU was off and rolling, 64-58.

It was Payton's playmaking, he had 12 points and four rebounds at the break, that gave the Beavers the edge in the first half, and his defense on Oregon point guard David Girley that brought them back in the second.

Ortiz also played a well-balanced game despite being in foul trouble the second half, overpowering Meyer and Oregon's sagging defense for 19 points on eight of 12 shooting from the floor, and eight rebounds.

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
