The Dance Brigade

Formed three years ago by the Wallflower Order, a women's dance theatre collective with Eugene roots, the Dance Brigade continues today the movement from a foundation in classical and modern dance technique to one that incorporates martial arts, sign language, theatre and comedy. One of the more remarkable aspects of the company is their ability to give expression to challenging social conditions.

The Dance Brigade has seen much success since their founding. In 1985, they completed a 12-city tour, including a performance at the Vancouver Folk Festival. In June of 1986, the company held its first annual Dance Festival for Social Change to showcase companies and artists who have socially relevant themes in their repertoire. The company is currently developing a multi-ethnic production of Tchaikovsky's "Nutcracker".

The company will perform January 16, 17 and 18 at 8:30 p.m. at the Community Center for the Performing Arts.
