between the contractor and representatives from the physical plant, office of public safety, the museum and the University planning office was held Wednesday and a final meeting between the architect, the University inspector, and the contractor will be held Friday to finalize site details on the project.

The project is expected to take between four and six months to complete, said Garry Fritz, architectural consultant for the physical plant.

The museum is being moved to the new site as part of the \$45 million science complex project, the largest single construction project ever undertaken at the University, said Harold Babcock, director of the physical plant.
