# Davis: Budget would be disaster for students

President Reagan's proposed 1988 budget would be a disaster for Oregon's students, according to William Davis, Oregon State System of Higher Education chancellor.

Davis voiced his concerns to Oregon's congressional delegates by letter on Friday, urging them to keep Oregon's higher education system in mind when debating the new budget.

Cuts of nearly 50 percent in student financial aid programs, as proposed by Reagan, would have an immediate effect on the ability of students to attend public colleges and universities, Davis wrote.

"Reduction in enrollments at our various colleges and universities will directly affect the

quality and quantity of programs provided for our citizens at a time when a strong higher education program is vital to economic development in the

state," according to the letter.

The curtailment in federal student aid will mean students will leave college to look for work that does not exist in Oregon, Davis wrote. Upper-middle-class families might be willing to acquire commercial loans for their children's education costs, but lower-income groups might not meet credit ratings required by lenders, the letter said.

Financial assistance is a proven necessity for many students attending Oregon's State System schools, Davis wrote. In the 1985-86 school year, 32,214 State System students — 76 percent of the total full-time enrollment — received nearly \$96 million in aid from all sources, mostly from federal sources, he wrote.

Of that total, 63 percent was self-help related funding such as loans and work study, the letter said.

Based on 1985-86 aid awarded to the state's eight four-year colleges and universities, Davis wrote that:

•Abolishing college work study would prevent more than 5,000 students from earning more than \$4.2 million to help pay college costs.

•Abolishing Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grants would deny about 4,500 needy students more than \$3 million.

•Abolishing the State Student Incentive Grants would reduce by \$500,000 money that more than 8,000 State System students receive in state need grants.

•Providing no additional capital contributions for National Direct Student Loans would deny about 500 low-income students the opportunity to borrow more than \$590,000.

•Replacing Guaranteed Student Loans with loans at market interest rates would deny affordable student loans to more than 21,000 students who currently have borrowed more than \$48 million.

•Cuts in Pell Grants would reduce by \$6.8 million the amount of aid for the State System's most needy students; 5,000 or 32 percent fewer students would receive grant aid.

Oregon does not have the resources to either reduce the cost of tuition and fees to students or fund student assistance programs to replace those provided by the federal government, Davis wrote.
