The Huskies tried to hack away at the lead, but the Ducks' had set the pace and established control. Washington managed to pull within nine with 2:21 remaining, but the Ducks would not relinquish command.

"We didn't back off the last six or seven minutes like we have been," Monson said. "We had planned to push the ball up the court as fast as we could the whole game... and I think it made the difference."

Pushing the ball up the court

made Washington "think a little more about getting back on defense rather than going to the offensive boards as hard as they have in the past, and I also think it got them a little bit tired," said Greg Senior, who came off the bench to score six points, grab six rebounds and play tough defense underneath the basket after Sven Meyer and Balderston had both fouled out of the game.

Guard Anthony Taylor again led the Ducks' offense with 27

points, but he had a solid supporting cast with three others scoring in double figures.

Point guard Girley poured in 14 points, including three three-point buckets, while Sprague and Balderston both contributed 12 points in the victory.

Oregon takes another step in its season Saturday when it hosts Washington State University at 7:35 p.m. at McArthur Court.

Ducks trounce WSU, face Washington next

The Oregon women's basketball team has been struggling lately, but the Ducks may have got the spark they needed Thursday night as they motored over Washington State University, 101-55, in a Pacific-10 Conference tilt at Pullman.

An easy victory could not have come at better time for the Ducks, who improve to 4-2 in league play and 11-4 overall. They now travel to Seattle for Saturday night's important matchup against the second-place University of Washington Huskies, a team that owns a 35-game regular season winning streak on their home floor, Edmundson Pavilion.

Oregon's Lauri Landerholm, hampered by poor shooting the last few games, had no trouble finding the hoop Thursday. The junior guard was a perfect 11 for 11 from the field and hit all five of her free throws, finishing with a game-high 27 points in just 22 minutes of action.

Freshman center Stefanie Kasperski matched her best out-pout of the year with 17 points. Gabi Neumann contributed 12 points and 14 rebounds.

The Duck defense flustered the Cougars, who drop to 7-8 for the season, into shooting a mere 29 percent from the field for the game. Oregon, who held a 47-23 advantage at halftime, also outrebounded the opponents 56-43.

traced back to the industrial revolution, and more recently, to the civil rights movement, Bem said.

"The civil rights movement served as a catalyst for the women's movement," she said. "We began to question tradi-

tional models of how men and women should act, and this led naturally to a concern with how gender is assimilated and conceptualized by children."

Economic factors may have also played a part in the liberalization of attitudes about

sex roles, she said.

Bem added that only recently have women not been tied down by child rearing and have been able to exercise control over their reproductive lives.
