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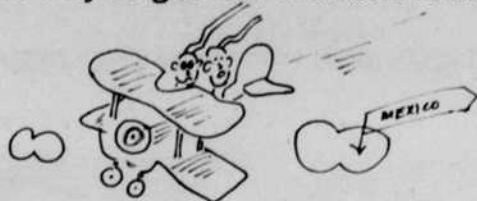

Ducks struggle with WSU but still triumph, 60-55

The Oregon men's basketball team "struggled" Saturday night against the visiting Washington State Cougars, as coach Don Monson put it, but still managed to escape with a 60-55 Pacific-10 Conference victory in McArthur Court before 8,111 spectators.

"We just didn't seem to have

the emotion or the concentration that we had the other night (Thursday against the Washington Huskies)," Monson said. "Some of that was due to Washington State's defense — they play a pretty tenacious defense, they're a good rebounding team and we had a tough time getting out on the break."

Senior guard David Girley agreed that the Ducks were lacking emotion against the Cougars: "We were a step out of sink, we were flat and we didn't have the enthusiasm we had coming out Thursday."

The win, improving Oregon

to 10-8 overall and 4-5 in conference play, was the Ducks' second straight after three consecutive Pac-10 road losses. The Ducks also extended their Mac Court winning string to seven.

"It's kind of good to know that you really didn't play extremely well... and still won," Monson admitted. "But I told my club that we can't play like this very often and expect to win."

Without a doubt, the difference in the game proved to be the first four minutes of the second half.

The Ducks floundered in the first half, shooting a frigid 30.8 percent from the field on eight of 26 and were fortunate to dodge disaster as they went into the locker room only two points down, 29-27.

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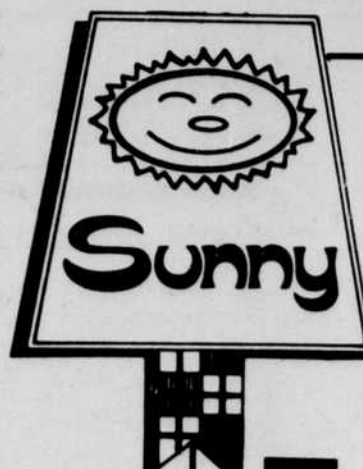
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
