

Women suffer disappointing loss to Huskies

The ghosts that have haunted Oregon the past few weeks paid a return visit to the Ducks Saturday night in Seattle, and they were accompanied by a few new ones.

The end result was a disappointing 69-57 loss in a pivotal matchup against first-place University of Washington in Pacific-10 Conference women's basketball. The loss drops the Ducks to 4-3 in league play and 11-5 overall, into a three-way tie for third place along with Pac-10 rivals Oregon State University and University of California at Los Angeles.

In a game that was reminiscent of the UCLA game one week ago, Oregon forged a seven-point lead in each half, but was outscored 23-8 the final six minutes of this contest. The

Ducks were hampered by turnovers — they coughed up the ball on 20 occasions in the game — and an inability to execute their offense down the stretch. They paid the price.

"We obviously lost a little control in key times of the

game," said Oregon coach Elwin Heiny. "We had opportunities to put the game out of reach, and we just threw the ball away."

Oregon's woes actually began late in the first half, when

leading scorer Lauri Landerholm was saddled with three of Oregon's five team fouls. The junior guard sat out the last seven minutes of the first session and didn't start the second half. From the field, Landerholm shot a dismal five

of 16 (she had hit all 11 of her field goal attempts in Thursday's game against Washington State University).

"This was the most physical game I've seen in a while. There was a lot of banging and shov-

ing that didn't get called," Heiny said. "I guess we just didn't play physical enough."

Despite the rough nature of the game, Oregon still out-rebounded Washington, 46-38. The Ducks once again had trouble scoring, however, as they shot at a .375 clip for the game and hit only nine of 18 free throws.

Landerholm wound up with 14 points as Oregon's high scorer, and centers Stefanie Kasperski and Gabi Neumann contributed 12 points each. Neumann also grabbed a team-high 10 boards.

Washington, a team that now boasts a 37-game winning streak in the regular season at Edmundson Pavilion, was paced by forward Lisa Oriard's 16 points and seven rebounds.

It appeared the Ducks were ready for this road trip, especially after blowing out WSU in Pullman two days earlier by a 101-55 margin, and were heading into the dogfight against the Huskies with renewed optimism.

"It was too easy at WSU. Had we played Washington first (on the trip), we might have been tougher," Heiny said.

Once again, Heiny points to the fact that Oregon just has not had the time to practice, and that alone has been a major determinant in the recent slide, which has seen the Ducks drop three of their last five games.

"I really feel this is a result of our schedule; we just need some good, solid practice. I think once we get back to playing two games a week, instead of three, things will get better," he said.

"We're tired. No one's taking this easily," he added.

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
