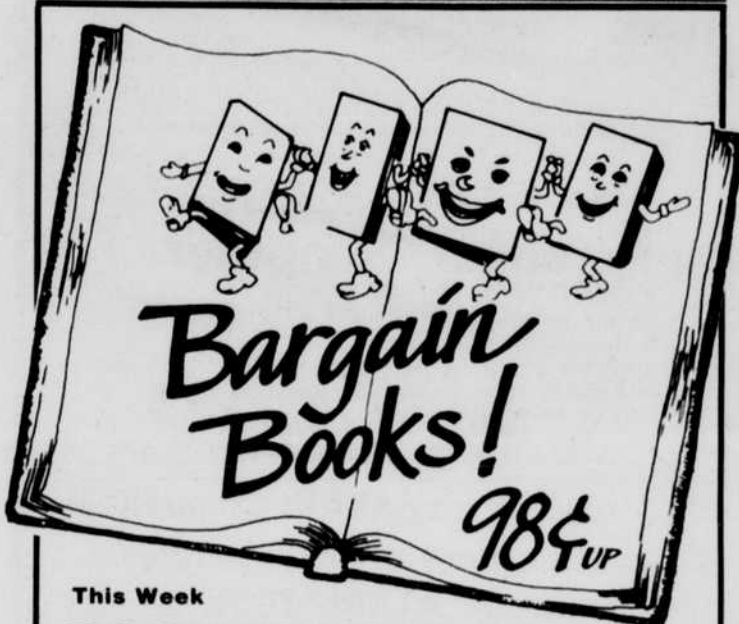

before the fall of 1987," said Don Van Houten, acting dean of arts and sciences. "The two major issues (for English instructors) are course loads and pay rates, and we hope to deal with both of those soon.

"I hope they will not feel the need to get organized. I hope we can address their concerns here," Van Houten said.

But Duncan said the AFT organization would not be an adversary of the University ad-

ministration. "It should create a cooperative atmosphere that gives us an opportunity to sit down and look at the problems as adults," he said.

Despite the lukewarm response the AFT has generated among tenure-track faculty, Duncan said he is confident that a different attitude exists among instructors and researchers, who share "a sense of community, a community of needs," and will be more receptive to the union idea.

A delegation of instructors and researchers met with University President Paul Olum two weeks ago to discuss some of their concerns, said University Provost Dick Hill. Coral Mack, a senior English instructor who was part of that delegation, said Olum was sympathetic with their concerns, but that many past attempts to gain relief through informal administrative channels have resulted in frustration.
